#### 1.0 Introduction

Under federal regulations, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has a responsibility for the development and distribution of Area Contingency Plans (ACPs), in the event of a response due to the release of oil or hazardous substances.

Section 4202 of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA 90) amended Subsection (j) of Section 311 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (FWPCA) (33 U.S. Code [U.S.C.] 1321 (j)) established areas for contingency planning. The authority to designate areas, determine the information to be included in ACPs, and review and approve such plans has been delegated by Executive Order 12777 dated October 22, 1991 to the Administrator of the EPA for the inland area and to the Commandant of the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) for the coastal zone. The EPA Region III Inland Area has been designated as the inland area of the states of Delaware, District of Columbia (D.C.), Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia. To facilitate planning, the EPA Region III Inland Area is divided into sub-areas. This plan is Volume II of the EPA Region III Inland Area Contingency Plan (IACP) and covers the D.C.-Extended Sub-Area.

#### 1.1 Purpose and Objective

The purpose of this D.C.-Extended Sub-Area Contingency Plan (SACP) is to assist first responders and representatives of local, state, and federal agencies to respond in an effective and timely manner to an oil discharge or release of a hazardous substance in the D.C.-Extended Sub-Area. To achieve this purpose, the plan addresses two objectives. The first objective is to help coordinate a response to substantial hazardous substance release or imminent release, by providing knowledge of private industry, local, state, and federal resources available to mitigate the release. The second objective is to facilitate the coordination of private, local, state, and federal entities that have jurisdiction in the D.C.-Extended Sub-Area.

#### 1.2 Statutory Authority

This SACP supplements Volume I of the EPA Region III IACP and was prepared in accordance with Section 311(j) of the Clean Water Act (CWA), as amended by OPA 90, 33 U.S.C. 1252 et.seq.

#### 2.0 Geographic Boundaries and Description

The District of Columbia, six counties in the State of Maryland, and 14 counties and six cities in the Commonwealth of Virginia form the D.C.-Extended Sub-Area. The counties and cities listed in Table 2-1 and shown on Figure 2-1 are included in this sub-area due to geographic proximity to the District of Columbia.

Federal, state, local, and technical contact information is presented in Appendix A.






#### 2.1 Sensitive Areas


Sensitive areas are divided into areas of special economic and environmental importance. Sensitive areas also include biological, natural, and historical and cultural resources that are protected by state and federal laws. Economically sensitive areas include water-dependent recreational, commercial, and anthropological areas. Environmentally sensitive areas include habitats, land management areas, national and state parks, state forests, wildlife management areas, drinking water intakes and biological resource areas. Lists of the sensitive areas are provided in Section 2 of IACP Volume I and the fish and wildlife information will be included in the EPA Region III IACP Viewer, which supplements this SACP. A list of historical resources for each county is provided in Appendix L.



#### 3.0 Roles and Responsibilities of Government Agencies

This section summarizes the roles and responsibilities for federal, state, and local entities in relation to response to a significant oil spill or release of hazardous materials.

#### 3.1 Federal

This section addresses the national response system and policies, EPA Region III roles and responsibilities, and government agency and contractor roles and responsibilities.

#### 3.1.1 National Response System and Policies

The National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan, more commonly called the National Contingency Plan (NCP), 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Section 300.105, is the federal government's blueprint for responding to both oil and hazardous substance releases. The latest revisions to the NCP were finalized in 1994 to reflect the oil spill provisions of OPA 90. The NCP specifies the roles and responsibilities among federal, state, and local governments and describes resources that are available for response. Sections 300.110 and 300.115 detail the structure of the National Response Team (NRT), and Regional Response Teams (RRT). The NCP provides for an RRT whose agency membership parallels that of the NRT and would include state and local representatives. The National Response System is immediately activated upon notification to the National Response Center (NRC) at (800) 424-8802.

#### 3.1.2 EPA Region III Roles and Responsibilities

EPA Region III in Philadelphia, PA, will provide a Federal On-Scene Coordinator (FOSC) for investigating and responding to hazardous substance releases occurring in this sub-area. The pre-designated FOSC for the D.C. Extended Sub-Area is Charlie Fitzsimmons, who is located at Ft. Meade, MD, for geographical proximity purposes to this sub-area. He can be reached at 443-223-9774.

The FOSC shall ensure that a state or local response occurs or direct response efforts and coordinate all other efforts at the scene of a discharge or release in accordance with the NCP; this sub-area response plan; and any applicable inland area response, state, and local plans. FOSCs are pre-designated by the President through the EPA Regional Administrator. Should Department of Defense (DOD) or Department of Energy (DOE) facilities or properties be involved in a discharge or release, each respective federal department will pre-designate an FOSC, as stated in the NCP Sections 300.120 (c) and (d).

The FOSC will coordinate all federal containment, removal, and disposal efforts and direct all federal resources during the incident. The FOSC is the point of contact between federal resources and the responsible party (RP), and the state and local response community. The FOSC will determine the need to establish an Incident Commander (IC) as circumstances warrant. If an Incident Command System (ICS) is necessary, the FOSC works within an established ICS or coordinates all agencies or parties into a Unified Command System (UCS). In some circumstances, the FOSC may direct the response activities of other parties in accordance with the NCP. In extreme circumstances, when it is evident that the RP is unwilling or unable to respond adequately to a spill or release, the FOSC can assume full authority of the cleanup, including funding through Superfund or the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund (OSLTF). In such instances, notice will be provided to the RP.

The EPA Region III RRT is available to provide guidance to the FOSC and assist with coordination during a major event.

For more detailed information, please refer to the NCP, Section 300.320.

#### 3.1.3 National Guard Civil Support Teams

The National Guard Weapons of Mass Destruction Civil Support Teams (WMD-CST) were established to deploy rapidly to assist a local IC in determining the nature and extent of an attack or incident; provide expert technical advice on WMD response operations; and help identify and support the arrival of follow-on state and federal military response assets. They are joint units and can consist of both Army and Air National Guard personnel, with some of the units commanded by Air National Guard Lieutenant Colonels. The mission of WMD-CST is to support local and state authorities at domestic WMD/Nuclear, Biological & Chemical (NBC) incident sites by identifying agents and substances, assessing current and projected consequences, advising on response measures, and assisting with requests for additional military support.

The following National Guard Civil Support Teams operate within the D.C.-Extended Sub-Area:

- The 32<sup>nd</sup> National Guard Civil Support Team-WMD responds to incidents in Maryland and is located at Ft. Meade, MD.
- The 33<sup>rd</sup> National Guard Civil Support Team responds to incidents in Washington, D.C. and is located in Washington, D.C..
- The 34<sup>th</sup> National Guard Civil Support Team responds to incidents in Virginia and is located in Blackstone, VA.

#### 3.2 State Government

#### 3.2.1 State of Maryland

Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) is the enforcement agency for environmental laws in Maryland and is responsible for responding to and directing cleanups of oil spills and hazardous substances. For this sub-area, MDE will respond from its Frostburg and Hagerstown offices. MDE has full response capability and trained response personnel. MDE's equipment includes personal protective equipment (PPE) for entry work, monitoring and sampling equipment, and containment and communications supplies.

The Maryland Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) is responsible for planning and coordinating responses to all types of emergencies, including spills of oil and hazardous substances and natural disasters. MEMA plays a major role in a spill response if the spill crosses county lines or exceeds the capabilities of local resources. MEMA can assist with activating mutual aid agreements and cost recovery. MEMA also assists counties with pre-emergency planning and approves county emergency response plans.

MEMA draws its authority from Article 16-A of the Annotated Code of Maryland. This Article created MEMA and authorizes the political subdivisions of the state to create emergency management offices of their own. Article 16-A also gives the Governor of Maryland emergency powers, such as temporarily waiving state laws that may interfere with emergency response operations. The Governor also is responsible for requesting federal disaster relief should the emergency or natural disaster exceed the response resources of the state.

#### 3.2.2 Commonwealth of Virginia

The Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM) is a state agency that reports to the Secretary of Public Safety and the Governor of Virginia. VDEM works closely with local government Emergency Managers, other state agencies, voluntary organizations, and federal agencies such as FEMA, to ensure efficient and effective preparedness and response to emergencies and disasters throughout Virginia.

VDEM acts as the state emergency operations center with 24-hour staffing. VDEM coordinates state government resources to assist localities in times of emergency and disasters, including hazardous materials (HAZMAT) response. The agency has 10 Materials Officers covering 13 HAZMAT regional response teams. VDEM has a disaster recovery team, as well as ground and air search and rescue resources.

The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (VDEQ) in the Commonwealth of Virginia and the agency that coordinates state responses to oil spills. Agency personnel are available 24 hours per day for investigation of pollution incidents and assessment of environmental damage. The VDEQ can also provide laboratory services and water quality survey assistance. Requests for disposal sites and incinerators for wastes should be cleared through this agency.

#### 3.2.3 District of Columbia

District of Columbia's Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency (HSEMA) coordinates the city's response to disasters, emergencies, severe weather conditions, and other catastrophic events. It works closely with other emergency response agencies, including the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), the District of Columbia Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services, and other District and federal agencies, as well as with the major utility companies and organizations such as the Red Cross and Salvation Army.

The HSEMA Operations Division runs the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The EOC is the city's main operational control and communications facility during an emergency, disaster, or special event. The center utilizes the latest information system software to monitor the MPD and the District of Columbia Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services emergency communications system, and is linked via teletype to the National Weather Service, the Washington Area Warning System (WAWAS) and the National Warning System (NAWAS).

The District Department of the Environment (DDOE) is responsible for enforcement of environmental regulations within the District of Columbia and performs facility inspections.

DDOE also has some capability to respond to oil and hazardous substance releases and can support the Incident Commander (IC) in a limited capacity. DDOE also has responsibility under Emergency Support Function (ESF) 12 under the District Emergency Response Plan. The agencies are presented in Appendix F of Volume II.

#### 3.3 Local Governments

In most cases, the first local response to a discharge of oil or release of a hazardous substance will be handled by the local government, and will likely include response by the jurisdictional fire department, police department, and local HAZMAT team(s). It may require the involvement of the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) or county Emergency Management Agencies (EMAs). The local government entity may call on support from area response contractors.

#### 3.3.1 Local Responder Roles and Responsibilities

During any fire or incident involving a discharge of oil or release of hazardous substances, the local jurisdiction will respond. Typically, the local fire department will respond and will provide an IC as the response is undertaken. The fire department will continue to provide an IC as threats to human life and safety issues warrant. The local police department normally will be responsible for traffic and crowd control on public property. Municipal public works departments will provide assistance in the event that the flow of a hazardous substance needs to be diverted or prevented from entering the storm water or sewer system.

As part of the notification process, the national response system should be activated by notification to the NRC at (800) 424-8802. This notification will alert state and federal support resources and will activate the FOSC. If an RP is identified and involved, the IC, state and FOSC, and the RP may establish a Unified Command System (UCS) to address the situation (See Sections 3.1 and 3.2).

#### 3.3.2 HAZMAT Team Roles and Responsibilities

Some counties within this sub-area do not have their own HAZMAT teams and depend on the MEMA, MDE, VDEM, VDEQ, and the D.C. HSEMA. These agencies prepare for and respond to emergencies involving oil and hazardous substance spills, nuclear power plant incidents, and other environmental crises.

Table 3-1 lists the counties with certified HAZMAT teams within the sub-area. These teams are capable of responding in Level "A" PPE to a HAZMAT incident. Table 3-1 also indicates which counties currently participate in the Maryland Emergency Assistance Compact (MEMAC) and Virginia's Statewide Mutual Aid Agreement (SMA).

The MEMAC and the SMA are mutual aid agreements that allow counties to access each other's resources during an emergency. The MEMAC and the SMA are included as Appendix N. Counties without certified HAZMAT teams may seek HAZMAT assistance from MDE and VDEM regional HAZMAT teams, contract with local response contractors, or seek assistance from another county that participates in the MEMAC or SMA.

Once on scene, HAZMAT teams will operate under the prevailing ICS. None of the response teams perform remedial cleanups.

The Northern Virginia Regional HAZMAT Response Team responds to approximately 130 suspected hazardous materials incidents annually occurring in the City of Alexandria, Arlington County, Fairfax County, Loudoun County, and portions of Prince William and Fauquier Counties. Their primary response area is Northern Virginia, but the team can be deployed wherever needed within the Commonwealth of Virginia.

#### 3.3.3 LEPC Roles and Responsibilities

Local emergency planning districts and LEPCs were set up as a result of Title III of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA). LEPCs in each county are committed to the safety of the citizens of that county by assuring proper resources and planning for environmental emergencies. LEPCs are groups of emergency responders, planners, business representatives, health care providers, elected officials, citizens, and media that work together for the protection of human health and the environment. According to SARA Title III, LEPCs must develop a written plan for responding to incidents involving the release of hazardous materials.

#### 3.3.4 Emergency Management Agency Roles and Responsibilities

If an incident escalates or threatens to escalate into an emergency that could affect large numbers of the population or the off-site environment, or otherwise may exceed the capacity of the local responders, the county's Department of Emergency Management or EMA becomes involved. The county may then activate its Emergency Operations Center, initiate an evacuation, or take other action to protect human health and the environment. Contact names, telephone numbers and email addresses for county emergency management contacts are provided on each individual county's fact sheet. In addition, county emergency management points of contact are consolidated for reference in Appendix F.

#### 3.4 Response Assets

Some response assets and special teams are available to assist the FOSC both in the field and in a support role.

#### 3.4.1 Regional Response Team

The EPA Region III RRT (RRT III) is made up of representatives from federal departments and agencies and each of the states or commonwealths in Federal Region III. RRT III is co-chaired by the Chief of the Superfund & Emergency Management Division, Preparedness and Response Branch from the EPA's regional office in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and the Captain, Marine Safety Division, of the USCG's Atlantic Area/Fifth District Office located in Portsmouth, Virginia. RRT III is a planning, policy, and coordinating body that does not respond directly to the scene of a spill or release. It provides assistance as requested by the FOSC during an incident.

Under the NCP, 40 CFR Section 300.180, governors are asked to assign an office or agency to represent the state on the RRT. The state's representative may participate fully in all aspects of RRT activity and shall designate the appropriate element of the state government that would undertake direction of state-managed oil or hazardous substance releases. Each state RRT

member also represents and coordinates the RRT involvement of various other state, county, and municipal organizations.

Committees within the RRT III include the Executive Committee and the Inland Area Committee. Workgroups within the RRT III include the Spill Response and Countermeasures, Consultation and Natural Resources Damage Assessment (CNRDA), Information Management and Outreach (IMO), Regional Contingency Plan (RCP) Rewrite, RRT Relationship with Area Committees (ACs), and State Emergency Response Commissions (SERCs) workgroups. These workgroups are available to provide specific expertise as needed in the event of a spill or release.

#### 3.4.2 EPA Environmental Response Team

In the event of a continuing release or discharge, a FOSC has access to the EPA Environmental Response Team (ERT) based in Edison, New Jersey. The ERT has expertise in treatment technology, biology, chemistry, hydrology, geology, and engineering. The ERT has access to special decontamination equipment and can provide advice on a wide range of diverse issues, such as a multimedia sampling and analysis program; on-site safety, including development and implementation plans; cleanup techniques and priorities; water supply decontamination and protection; application of dispersants; environmental assessment; degree of cleanup required; and disposal of contaminated material. The ERT provides assistance via Scientific Support Coordinators (SSCs). An SSC may be designated by the FOSC as the principal advisor for scientific issues and communication with the scientific community. This includes coordination of requests for assistance from state and federal agencies.

#### 3.4.3 EPA National Decon Team

In the event of a large-scale contamination of public facilities, the FOSC can call upon the EPA National Decon Team (NDT) to assist with effective decontamination measures. The NDT can provide deconologists in multiple media events. The NDT is located in Cincinnati, Ohio and is available on a 24-hour basis.

#### 3.4.4 EPA Radiological Emergency Response Team

In the event of a release or threat of a release of radiological substance, the FOSC has access to EPA's Radiological Emergency Response Team (RERT). The RERT can provide health physicists and air monitoring/sampling as part of its field response team. The RERT is located in Montgomery, Alabama and Las Vegas, Nevada.

#### 3.4.5 USCG District Response Group

The sub-area is situated within USCG District 5 and Sector MD/NCR. The District 5 Response Group is responsible for providing support to USEPA FOSCs in the DC Extended Sub-Area. Although the sector does not have jurisdiction in the sub-area, they may support the FOSC for river responses and during major flooding events, or as requested. USCG assets include: USCG small boats, cutters, and aircraft. Technical support includes: Atlantic Strike Team and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Scientific Support Coordinator (SSC). Assistance from Sector MD/NCR can be requested at 410-576-2525.

#### 3.4.6 USCG National Strike Force

The three USCG Strike Force (Atlantic, Gulf, and West Strike Teams) provide trained personnel and specialized equipment to assist the FOSC in spill response training, stabilizing and containing the spill, and monitoring or directing the response actions of the responsible parties or contractors. The FOSC may contact the team directly for assistance. Within the sub-area,

assistance from the USCG Atlantic Strike Team located in Fort Dix, New Jersey, can be requested from 609-724-0008 or through the NRC at 800-424-8802.

#### 3.4.7 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), under the Department of Commerce, may provide information in a number of areas. Like the ERT, its SSCs have a wide variety of expertise. NOAA has mathematicians and physicists who can perform computer modeling and simulation studies of releases. NOAA also has a research and planning group that can determine resources at risk and make recommendations on types of techniques for cleanup and timing of cleanup. The agency can offer an environmental science group that can provide technical assistance on chemistry, gas chromatography and mass spectrometry, fingerprinting, and degradation of oil. The agency includes a biological assessment group that can perform long-term studies and planning. Finally, NOAA has an information management group that can produce computerized maps.

#### 3.4.8 EPA Contractors

EPA Region III contracts Superfund Technical Assessment and Response Team (START) and Emergency and Rapid Response Services (ERRS) contractors to respond to emergency situations and cleanups. The EPA FOSC can mobilize these contractors as necessary to incidents within the D.C.-Extended Sub-Area.

#### 3.4.8.1 Superfund Technical Assessment and Response Team Contractor

Many activities conducted during a response can be assisted by START. START includes private contractors working for EPA and trained to support EPA response efforts. These personnel are trained to respond to oil spills and releases of hazardous substances, including biological, chemical, and radiological agents. START has monitoring and sampling equipment available, as well as a limited amount of containment equipment. START members will conduct their activities in accordance with the ICS or UCS and as directed by the FOSC.

#### 3.4.8.2 Emergency and Rapid Response Services Contractor

The Emergency and Rapid Response Services (ERRS) contractors provide emergency, time-critical removal, and quick remedial response cleanup services for the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), OPA 90 and underground storage tank (UST) programs. These contractors may also be called upon to provide cleanup support in instances of natural disasters, such as floods, pursuant to the Federal Response Plan, to protect the American Public or the environment per existing and/or incident-specific agreements. These contractors provide cleanup personnel, equipment, and materials to contain, recover, or dispose of hazardous substances, analyze samples, and site restoration.

#### 3.4.9 Other Contractors

Private contractors can provide a wide range of technical support during a response, either on a one-time or long-term basis. Contractors can provide personnel, equipment, or other assistance during a response. RPs may have contracts with Oil Spill Removal Organizations (OSROs) or with HAZMAT contractors to handle spills that may occur. Any contractor responding to an oil spill or a release of hazardous substances will answer to the agency or organization providing its funding, unless arrangement for supervision by other agencies is agreed to by all parties. Local contractor contact information is presented in Appendix H.

#### 3.5 Natural Resources, Federal and State Trustees

Federal natural resource trustees are appointed by the U. S. President and are the Secretaries of the Departments of the Interior, Commerce, Agriculture, Defense and Energy. These trustees are responsible for natural resources located on, over, or under land administered by each agency. Federal natural resource trustee contact information is presented in Appendix B.

#### 3.5.1 Department of the Interior

The Department of the Interior (DOI) can provide information concerning land and resources specifically under DOI jurisdiction, as well as offer technical expertise related to geology, hydrology, minerals, fish and wildlife, cultural and recreational resources. DOI can also provide communication and other equipment in the event of a prolonged response.

#### 3.5.2 State Natural Resource Agencies

Wildlife biologists with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) and the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation (VDCR) can provide locations of environmentally sensitive areas and advise on how seasonal changes affect animal concentrations or movements. If natural resources are harmed or threatened by the discharge of oil or release of hazardous substances, biologists help locate licensed and trained wildlife rehabilitators and can assist with the recovery of injured birds and animals. These agencies can provide water transportation to assess damage to wildlife and habitat.

#### 3.5.3 Natural Resource Trustees

Pursuant to 33 U.S.C. Section 2706 (b), the governor of each state shall designate state and local officials who may act on behalf of the public as trustees for natural resources and shall notify the U.S. President of the designation. CERCLA and OPA 90 require the designation of certain federal, state, or Indian tribal officials to act on behalf of the public as trustees of natural resources that they manage or protect. CERCLA Section 101(16) defines natural resources as land, fish, wildlife, biota, air, water, groundwater, drinking water supplies, and other such resources belonging to, managed by, held in trust by, appertaining to, or otherwise controlled by the United States, any state or local government, or Indian tribe. The NCP directs FOSCs to work with trustees in response activities to help ensure that natural resources are protected when they are at risk from an actual or potential oil spill or hazardous substance release.

During response activities, FOSCs must:

- Notify all state and federal trustees of oil spills and hazardous substance releases.
- Coordinate response activities with the affected Natural Resource Trustees, and to consult with the affected trustees on the appropriate removal actions to be taken.
- Share nonmonetary response resources with Natural Resource Trustees conducting Natural Resource Damage Assessment activities so long as this does not hinder response activities.
- Provide funding (up to the approved ceiling for the incident) to pay for Natural Resource Trustees' assistance to the FOSC on response to oil spills.

#### 3.5.3.1 State Trustees

The State natural resources trustees for the D.C.-Extended Sub-Area are presented in Appendix D.

#### 4.0 Protection Strategies

To protect and prevent further damage to sensitive areas in a spill incident, protection strategies and countermeasures should be utilized. In this Sub-Area Plan, the primary sensitive areas are the Potomac and Anacostia Rivers, Chesapeake Bay, inland waterways, recreational areas, streams, fisheries, endangered plants, animals, and their supporting habitats, and drinking water intakes. Where aggressive protection of fisheries and wildlife is necessary, the Fish and Wildlife Response (referenced in the EPA Region III IACP, Volume I) provides appropriate direction. General protection strategies include diversion booms along the sensitive areas to minimize impact; removal of the spilled material, if these actions can be performed without disrupting sediments; and use of sorbent pads to soak up spilled materials. Drinking water intakes should be protected before oil impact or should be turned off once impacted. Surface water intakes should be protected with diversion booming to deflect spilled product away from intake. Double booming is recommended, where possible.

#### 5.0 Integration With Other Plans

This SACP is one of many tools available during an emergency response. This section briefly describes the integration of the SACP with other relevant plans.

#### 5.1 Private Sector Response Plans

Facility operators are required to adhere to various plans required by federal and state regulations in an effort to prevent or mitigate releases or discharges into the environment. In an effort to streamline the planning process, the NRT's Integrated Contingency Plan (ICP) Guidance was published in the Federal Register in June 1996. The purpose of the ICP was to provide a tool for consolidating multiple plans that facilities may have prepared to comply with various regulations into one functional emergency response plan. Adherence to ICP guidance is not required to comply with federal regulatory requirements. A number of statutes and regulations administered by several federal agencies include requirements for emergency response planning. A particular facility may be subject to one or more of the following federal regulations:

- EPA's Oil Pollution Prevention Regulation (Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasures [SPCC] and Facility Response Plan Requirements) - 40 CFR part 112.7(d) and 112.20-21
- EPA's Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA) (EPCRA is Title III of SARA.)
- EPA's Resource Conservation and Recovery Act Contingency Planning Requirements 40 CFR part 264, Sub-part D, 40 CFR part 265 Sub-part D, and 40 CFR 279.52
- Clean Air Act (CAA) 40 CFR part 68
- EPA's Risk Management Programs Regulation 40 CFR part 68
- Minerals Management Service's Facility Response Plan Regulation 30 CFR part 254
- Research and Special Programs Administration's Pipeline Response Plan Regulation 49 CFR part 194
- USCG's Facility Response Plan Regulation 33 CFR part 154 Sub-part F
- Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) Emergency Action Plan Regulation 29 CFR part 1910.38(a)
- OSHA's Process Safety Standard 29 CFR part 1910.119
- OSHA's Hazardous Waste Operator Regulation 29 CFR 1910.120

#### 5.1.1 Facility Response Plans

Facilities that could cause "substantial harm" to the environment due to bulk oil storage are required to prepare and submit a Facility Response Plan (FRP). Appendix J presents the facilities located in this sub-area that have submitted an FRP.

A facility may pose "substantial harm" according to the FRP rule if it:

- 1) Has a total oil storage capacity greater than or equal to 42,000 gallons and it transfers oil over water to/from a vessel; or
- 2) Has a total oil storage capacity greater than or equal to one million gallons or meets one of the following conditions:
  - a) Does not have sufficient secondary containment for each aboveground storage area.

- b) Is located at a distance such that a discharge from the facility could cause "injury" to fish, wildlife and sensitive environments.
- c) Is located at a distance such that a discharge from the facility would shut down a public drinking water intake.
- d) Has had, within the past five years, a reportable discharge greater than or equal to 10,000 gallons.

An EPA Regional Administrator determines if a facility could, because of its location, cause significant and substantial harm to the environment by discharging oil into, or on, the navigable waters and adjoining shorelines. This is determined by factors similar to the substantial harm criteria, as well as the age of tanks, proximity to navigable waters, discharge frequency, or other information. Facilities that pose significant and substantial harm must have their plans reviewed and approved by the EPA.

#### 5.1.2 Risk Management Plan Facilities

Section 112(r) of the CAA requires EPA to promulgate regulations for the prevention and mitigation of accidental releases of extremely hazardous substances. Under this section, EPA established a list of regulated substances and thresholds and issued the Chemical Accident Prevention regulations ((40 CFR 68.190). The goals of this program are to prevent accidental releases of chemicals that could cause serious harm to human health or the environment and to reduce the severity of releases that may occur. Covered facilities are required to develop and implement a risk management program that includes a 5-year accident history, and an emergency response program. Companies must also submit to EPA a Risk Management Plan (RMP) describing the source's risk management program.

The chemical accident prevention program also requires full updates and re-submission of RMPs at least once every 5 years. Certain processes and other changes as specified in the 'update' section of 40 CFR 68.190 may require a facility to fully update and resubmit its RMP prior to the 5-year anniversary of an RMP. The 5-year anniversary date is reset whenever companies fully update and resubmit their RMPs. RMP information is confidential, and is not provided as public information. The sub-area FOSC holds access to this information and may provide it as appropriate.

#### 5.2 Local Response Plans

Sections 301 and 302 of EPCRA provide for the establishment of LEPCs within districts to facilitate the preparation and implementation of emergency plans.

#### 5.3 State Response Plans

Section 300.210(b) of the NCP provides for the establishment of RRTs and sets their role in the implementation of Regional Contingency Plans. The NCP also provides for the establishment of ACs and implementation of AC plans.

#### 5.4 Regional Plans

#### 5.4.1 Region III Response Plans for Oil Spill Countermeasures

The EPA Region III RRT (RRT III) has established a specific protocol for utilizing oil spill countermeasures within the region. All federal agencies, natural resource trustees, state agencies, and local response organizations are subject to the response action requirements approved by the RRT III. Response countermeasures typically include (but are not limited to) in situ burning, decanting, dispersant application, bioremediation, solidifier usage, and surface washing. All of these response activities are subject to the RRTIII Regional Contingency Plan, as well as to the RRT III Inland and Coastal Area Contingency Plans. Pertinent plans affecting response activities in the D.C. Sub Area are provided as Appendix G.

#### **5.4.2 Geographic Response Plans**

A Geographic Response Plan has been established within the D.C. Sub Area, specific to the Potomac River. It provides specific strategies and tactics for oil discharges within this specific geographic area. The sub-area FOSC holds access to this information and may provide it as appropriate.

#### 5.5 National Plans

Section 300.2 of the NCP lists the various federal statutes that provide for the establishment of an NRT and the implementation of the NCP.

#### **6.0 Maryland County-by-County Information**

The State of Maryland is located within EPA's Region III (Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia) and is comprised of 23 counties and the City of Baltimore. The Washington, D.C. Extended Sub-Area includes 6 Maryland counties located in Southeastern MD. The EPA office in Fort Meade, Maryland, serves all of the Southeastern Maryland Counties that make up a portion of the Washington, D.C. Extended Sub-Area.

Under federal mandates (SARA Title 3 Sections 301-303 and EPCRA), Maryland is required to establish a State Emergency Response Commission (SERC), to designate local emergency planning districts, and to appoint a LEPC for each district. Industries are required to provide the government with information about their activities with hazardous and toxic chemicals. The SERC and the LEPCs have responsibilities to raise awareness for hazardous materials, to support planning efforts, to educate and train individuals for responding to and for handling hazardous materials, to mitigate issues, and to provide a response plan for disasters involving hazardous materials. In Maryland, MDE serves as the repository for all notifications, reports, and inventories that must be submitted to the SERC. The Maryland SERC designated the 23 counties, and the city of Annapolis, Baltimore City and Ocean City as LEPCs. In Maryland, the SERC is MEMA and the Director is appointed by the Governor.

For more details on the response mechanisms, notification, organization, and processes in the State of Maryland, see the EPA IACP Volume 1, Section 3C.

The following sections provide detailed information on a County by County basis for Maryland. This information is primarily oriented for EPA responders, but may be useful for others in the

response community in planning for and responding to emergencies. County sub-sections are presented in alphabetical order. Within each County sub-section, the following information is provided:

- Area of Responsibility. This lists the Townships or municipalities within the county.
- Response Systems and Policies. This section provides a narrative of any unique response systems and policies for the county.
- <u>County EMA Response Teams.</u> A list of County EMA Response Teams is provided. This data is obtained from the Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Infrastructure Security Program (DHS HSIP).
- <u>Fact Sheet.</u> This provides a single source for key emergency management and response points of contact for the county, as well as a detail map of the county.
  - HAZMAT Teams. A list of HAZMAT Teams that serve the county is provided.
     This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - Qualified Contractors. A list of response contractors serving the county.
  - Hospital Contacts. A list of hospitals serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - Mutual Aid Agreements. A list of in-effect Mutual Aid Agreements involving the county. This information was compiled by the U.S. EPA FOSC for the sub-area.
  - Water Intakes and Downstream Notifications. This information is confidential and is not provided in the public version of this volume. The sub-area FOSC has access to this information.
  - <u>Environmentally Sensitive Areas.</u> A list of locations that may be considered Environmentally Sensitive.
  - <u>Facility Response Plans.</u> A list of facilities that have Facility Response Plans onfile with the USCG/USEPA. This information was compiled by the U.S. EPA.
  - Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasures/Preparedness, Prevention and Contingency/Spill Prevention Response Plans. This information is managed on the State level and therefore is not provided in this Volume. This information is available from the State.
  - Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA). A list of SARA facilities in the county. This information was compiled by the U.S. EPA.
  - Risk Management Plans. This information is confidential and is not provided in the public version of this volume. The sub-area FOSC has access to this information.
  - Railroad Companies. A list of railroad companies serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - <u>Pipeline Companies.</u> A list of pipeline companies serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - <u>Equipment Resources.</u> Equipment resources serving the county.
  - o <u>LEPC Contacts.</u> A list of the LEPC contacts for the county.
  - <u>Elected Officials.</u> A list of elected officials for the county.
  - Power Utilities. A list of power utility companies serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - o <u>Military Installations.</u> A list of military installations in the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.

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This information is provided in table form. These tables are numbered consistently from county to county.

#### 6.1 Calvert County, MD


### **6.1.3 County EMA Response Teams**

The Charles County Emergency Management Division is responsible for the development, coordination and promotion of a comprehensive emergency management program incorporating planning, preparedness, response, and recovery activities relative to emergencies or disasters whether natural or man-made including; public education and information, and promotion of mitigation activities.

The EMD serves as liaison and collaboration with local, state and federal governmental agencies, for profit and nonprofit public and private institutions and volunteer organizations, as well as, activities related to the establishment of a comprehensive emergency management program.

The EMD develops and maintains the County's emergency operations plan which provides a framework for the coordination of emergency response activities across a broad spectrum of disciplines and agencies. The county also has a 9-1-1 Communications Center.


### **6.2.3 County EMA Response Teams**

### **6.4.2** Response Systems and Policies

Montgomery County is part of the National Capital Region (NCR). The National Capital Region was created pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952 (Title 40, U.S.C., Sec. 71). The Act defined the NCR as the District of Columbia; Montgomery and Prince George's Counties of Maryland; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William Counties of Virginia. Today, the NCR includes the District of Columbia and eleven local jurisdictions in the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The LEPC operates under bylaws adopted by voting members of the council. Under the provisions of EPCRA, the LEPC has developed a hazardous materials emergency response and preparedness plan for the planning district of Montgomery County, Maryland. The emergency response and preparedness plan establishes procedures for: conducting public information and education responsibilities; receiving and processing requests for information from the public; notifying the public and regulated businesses on all LEPC activities and meetings; making the Hazardous Materials Plan publicly available; and receiving reports and information as specified in EPCRA and in accordance with state and local hazardous materials reporting laws.

With the information and reports received from facilities operating within the planning district, the LEPC will perform a hazard analysis, establish and maintain a database of hazardous materials locations and quantities in the planning district together with emergency planning and notification information, and establish and maintain a computer system for data management. Information on all facilities with reportable quantities as well as Extremely Hazardous Substances (EHS) will be included in the emergency plan. All LEPC meetings, except those specified by the Chairman and announced in advance, are open to the public. The county has a 9-1-1 Communications Center.

#### 6.4.3 County EMA Response Teams

The County has a Special Operations Hazardous Incident Response Team (HIRT) made up of members from the Department of Public Safety, and Montgomery County Fire & Rescue Service.



#### 6.5.2 Response Systems and Policies

The mission of the Office of Homeland Security is to develop and maintain comprehensive emergency management programs through planning with federal, state and local official, and the private sector, to develop a coordinated safety and preparedness strategy; to protect life, property, and the environment from the effects of natural and man-made disasters, including terrorist acts and; to enhance the quality of life by receiving and processing 9-1-1 calls and dispatching Police, Sheriff, Fire and Emergency Medical Services.

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) is one of the agencies under the Office of Homeland Security and as such, it is responsible for the coordination of all County agencies, private organizations, businesses, persons, and other counties, cities and political subdivisions, to ensure the complete utilization of all available resources to effectively and efficiently mitigate, prepare for, respond to, and recover from any natural, technological or manmade emergency or disaster, regardless of size or complexity, including acts of terrorism.

OEM also coordinates the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services and Amateur Radio Emergency Services (RACES/ARES) Unit.

The county has a 9-1-1 Communications Center. The Emergency Operations Command includes: Fire/Rescue Operations, Advanced Emergency Medical Services, Operational Safety, and Quality Assurance. These elements provide emergency fire and rescue

services and basic ambulance services, the advanced life support and specialized fire and rescue functions, including high-rise, confined space, and underwater rescue. In addition, Quality Assurance focuses on monitoring, evaluating and adjusting the level of emergency and non-emergency service that is provided to our citizens through training and discipline.

The Prince Georges LEPC is comprised of county citizens as well as representatives from various businesses within the county who work in collaboration with employees of the county's Administration office, Public Safety and other departments with the goal on developing strategies for better serving the community of Prince George before, during and after natural and manmade disasters. This partnership enables all facets of the community to interact with those responsible for carrying out needed services.

The Prince George's County is part of the National Capital Region. The National Capital Region was created pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952 (Title 40, U.S.C., Sec. 71). The Act defined the NCR as the District of Columbia; Montgomery and Prince George's Counties of Maryland; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William Counties of Virginia. Today, the NCR includes the District of Columbia and eleven local jurisdictions in the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia.



#### 7.0 Virginia County-by-County Information

The Commonwealth of Virginia is located within EPA's Region III (Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia) and is comprised of ninety five (95) counties and thirty nine (39) independent cities. The Washington, D.C. Extended Sub-Area includes 14 Virginia counties, and 6 independent cities located in Northeastern Virginia. The EPA office in Fort Meade, Maryland serves all of the Northeastern Virginia Counties that make up a portion of the Washington, D.C. Extended Sub-Area.

The Commonwealth of Virginia is divided up into Counties and Independent Cities, each are described in more detail below. Incorporated cities in Virginia are independent of their surrounding counties. Other municipalities, even though they may be more populous than some existing independent cities, are incorporated as "towns", and as such form part of a county. Unlike Virginia's cities, and like municipalities in most other states, incorporated towns are municipalities that are within counties. Local government is thus divided between the town and the county. A town can be formed from any area with a defined boundary having a population of 1,000 or more. The method for forming towns is the same as for cities, petitioning the state legislature to grant a charter. Virginia also has unincorporated communities which are also called towns colloquially.

The list of municipalities contained within each County includes only cities and incorporated towns. All unincorporated towns (including those listed as Census Designated Places (CDPs)) were left off of the lists unless otherwise noted in each section.

Under federal mandates (SARA Title 3 Sections 301-303 and EPCRA), Virginia is required to establish a SERC, to designate local emergency planning districts, and to appoint a LEPC for each district. Industries are required to provide the government with information about their activities with hazardous and toxic chemicals. The SERC and the LEPCs have responsibilities to raise awareness for hazardous materials, to support planning efforts, to educate and train individuals for responding to and for handling hazardous materials, to mitigate issues, and to provide a response plan for disasters involving hazardous materials. In Virginia, VDEQ serves as the repository for all notifications, reports, and inventories that must be submitted to the SERC. In accordance with the federal laws, as its first responsibility, the Virginia Emergency Response Commission (VERC) established and appointed members to 111 LEPCs in Virginia. In Virginia, the VERC is VDEQ and the Director is appointed by the Governor. The formation of VERC also designated the Virginia Dept. of Emergency Management (Virginia DEM) to serve as the contact for facility immediate/emergency notification in the event of a release, spill, etc. The VDEM also serves as the lead agency in facilitating communication among LEPCs and providing LEPCs with technical assistance.

For more details on the response mechanisms, notification, organization, and processes in the Commonwealth of Virginia, see the EPA IACP Volume 1, Section 3C.

The following sections provide detailed information on a County by County basis for Maryland. This information is primarily oriented for EPA responders, but may be useful for others in the response community in planning for and responding to emergencies. County sub-sections are presented in alphabetical order. Within each County sub-section, the following information is provided:

Area of Responsibility. This lists the Townships or municipalities within the county.

- Response Systems and Policies. This section provides a narrative of any unique response systems and policies for the county.
- <u>County EMA Response Teams.</u> A list of County EMA Response Teams is provided. This data is obtained from the Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Infrastructure Security Program (DHS HSIP).
- <u>Fact Sheet.</u> This provides a single source for key emergency management and response points of contact for the county, as well as a detail map of the county.
  - HAZMAT Teams. A list of HAZMAT Teams that serve the county is provided.
     This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - Qualified Contractors. A list of response contractors serving the county.
  - Hospital Contacts. A list of hospitals serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - Mutual Aid Agreements. A list of in-effect Mutual Aid Agreements involving the county. This information was compiled by the U.S. EPA FOSC for the sub-area.
  - Water Intakes and Downstream Notifications. This information is confidential and is not provided in the public version of this volume. The sub-area FOSC has access to this information.
  - <u>Environmentally Sensitive Areas.</u> A list of locations that may be considered Environmentally Sensitive.
  - <u>Facility Response Plans.</u> A list of facilities that have Facility Response Plans onfile with the USCG/USEPA. This information was compiled by the U.S. EPA.
  - Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasures/Preparedness, Prevention and Contingency/Spill Prevention Response Plans. This information is managed on the State level and therefore is not provided in this Volume. This information is available from the State.
  - Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA). A list of SARA facilities in the county. This information was compiled by the U.S. EPA.
  - Risk Management Plans. This information is confidential and is not provided in the public version of this volume. The sub-area FOSC has access to this information.
  - Railroad Companies. A list of railroad companies serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - Pipeline Companies. A list of pipeline companies serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - o Equipment Resources. Equipment resources serving the county.
  - LEPC Contacts. A list of the LEPC contacts for the county.
  - Elected Officials. A list of elected officials for the county.
  - Power Utilities. A list of power utility companies serving the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.
  - Military Installations. A list of military installations in the county. This data is obtained from the DHS HSIP.

This information is provided in table form. These tables are numbered consistently from county to county.

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#### 7.1 City of Alexandria, VA

#### 7.1.1 Area of Responsibility

The City of Alexandria is located in the northeastern part of the state. It is bordered by Arlington County to the north; the Potomac River and Washington, D.C. to the east, and Fairfax County to the south. The City of Alexandria has a population of about 139,966. The address of the Division of Emergency Management is: 900 Second Street, Alexandria, VA 22314 (Telephone 703-746-5200).

#### 7.1.2 Response Systems and Policies

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM), which coordinates the City's processes of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery from man-made and natural disasters, is based in the Alexandria Fire Department. Our office maintains the City's Emergency Operations Center, which is used by City officials and related services and agencies to provide a coordinated response to major emergencies and disasters. OEM also maintains the City's Comprehensive Emergency Operations Plan, which identifies the responsibilities of all local departments and agencies, and serves as the City's liaison with the Virginia Department of Emergency Management and the Federal Emergency Management Agency and participates in the Emergency Management Assistance program, a federal grant program that assists state and local governments. The City also maintains an active 9-1-1 call center.

The City of Alexandria is part of the National Capital Region. The National Capital Region was created pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952 (Title 40, U.S.C., Sec. 71). The Act defined the NCR as the District of Columbia; Montgomery and Prince George's Counties of Maryland; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William Counties of Virginia. Today, the NCR includes the District of Columbia and eleven local jurisdictions in the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The City also has an active LEPC that reviews and advises on the City's emergency plans, including those aimed at addressing extremely hazardous substances (EHSs) that have been specified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The LEPC receives annual Hazardous Chemical Inventory reports (aka Tier II reports) from facilities that have certain quantities of hazardous chemicals (as defined by EPA) on site.

Hazardous Chemical Inventory reports, as well as the City of Alexandria's Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, are available for public review at the Alexandria Office of Emergency Management.

The LEPC meets quarterly at the call of the Chair, and all meetings are open to the public. For more information, please contact the Alexandria Office of Emergency Management, at 703.746.5200.


#### 7.1.3 County EMA Response Teams

The City of Alexandria is part of the Northern Virginia Hazardous Materials Response Team. This team of highly trained professionals responds to approximately 130 suspected hazardous materials incidents annually occurring in the City of Alexandria, Arlington County, Fairfax County, Loudoun County, and portions of Prince William and Fauquier Counties. Their primary response area is Northern Virginia, but the team can be deployed wherever needed within the Commonwealth of Virginia.

#### 7.2 City of Fairfax, VA

#### 7.2.1 Area of Responsibility

The City of Fairfax is located in the northeastern part of the state. It is bordered by Fairfax County on all sides. The City of Fairfax has a population of about 22,565. The address of the Division of Emergency Management is: 10455 Armstrong Street Suite 208. Fairfax, VA 22030 (Telephone 571-350-1000).

#### 7.2.2 Response Systems and Policies

The Office of Emergency Management seeks to promote a safer, less vulnerable city with the capacity to cope with hazards and disasters. Emergency management also protects the community by coordinating and integrating all activities necessary to build, sustain, and improve the capability to mitigate against, prepare for, respond to, and recover from threatened or actual natural disasters, acts of terrorism, or other man-made disaster.

The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is located within the building housing the Police Department on Old Lee Hwy.

Fairfax County operates the communication system for the county. All 9-1-1 calls that fall within the city jurisdiction are transferred to the City Police Department Communications Center.

The City of Fairfax Emergency Management Team (CFEMT) is established as an advisory body to coordinate emergency management functions with the Office of Emergency Management to prepare for, respond to, recover from, and mitigate the impact of a variety of hazards that could affect the City of Fairfax. The CFEMT advises specifically on such issues as policies, plans, procedures, training, exercises, and public education. The CFEMT is comprised of Emergency Coordination Officers who are selected by the agency head of the agency they represent. Each Emergency Coordination Officer serves in a primary or support role in a designated Emergency Support Function. Furthermore, as part of the CFEMT, they serve as an integral part of emergency operations in other capacities, i.e., as members of the Damage Assessment Teams, Community Outreach Teams, and Logistical Staging Area Managers. Thus, the Emergency Coordination Officers, as a part of the CFEMT, serve in an operational and advisory capacity by developing recommendations and implementing actions for improving the City's emergency management program.

The City of Fairfax is part of the National Capital Region. The National Capital Region was created pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952 (Title 40, U.S.C., Sec. 71). The Act defined the NCR as the District of Columbia; Montgomery and Prince George's Counties of Maryland; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William Counties of Virginia. Today, the NCR includes the District of Columbia and eleven local jurisdictions in the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia.

#### 7.2.3 County EMA Response Teams


The City is part of the Northern Virginia Hazardous Materials Response Team. This team of highly trained professionals responds to approximately 130 suspected hazardous materials incidents annually occurring in the City of Alexandria, Arlington County, Fairfax County, Loudoun County, and portions of Prince William and Fauguier

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Counties. Their primary response area is Northern Virginia, but the team can be deployed wherever needed within the Commonwealth of Virginia.



### 7.4 City of Fredericksburg, VA

### 7.4.1 Area of Responsibility

The City of Fredericksburg is located in the northeastern part of the state. It is bordered by Stafford County to the north and east and Spotsylvania County on the south, and west. The City of Fredericksburg has a population of about 24,286. The address of the Office of Emergency Management is: 601 Caroline Street, Suite 700, Fredericksburg, VA 22401 (Telephone 540-372-1059).

### 7.4.2 Response Systems and Policies

The Fire Department has been tasked with the responsibility of Emergency Management for The City of Fredericksburg. The Fire Chief was designated as Coordinator of Emergency Management and the Deputy Chief was designated as Deputy Coordinator of Emergency Management.

Emergency Management comprises organized analysis, planning, decision making, and assignment of available resources to mitigate, prepare for, respond to, and recover from the effects of "all hazards".

Some Areas of Responsibilities for Emergency Management include:

Homeland Security Grants (HSG), Citizens Emergency Response Team (CERT), Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), R911 Interactive Community Notification System (R911), Integrated Flow Observing and Warning System (IFLOWS), Local Capability Assessment for Readiness (LCAR), Local Emergency Management Performance Grant (LEMPG), Commercial Direct Assistance Program (CEDAP), Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP), Initial Strategy Implementation Plan (ISIP), Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC), HMP (Hazardous Mitigation Planning), Pandemic Flu, Flooding, Severe Weather, Evacuations, Emergency Sheltering, and Terrorism.

The police department operates and maintains a modern state-of-the-art public safety communications system, appropriately identified as the "Fredericksburg Emergency Communications Center." The communications center is a consolidated environment that coordinates the response efforts for Police, Fire, and Emergency Medical Services within the city limits, as well as to areas surrounding the city through mutual aid agreement.

The Emergency Communications Center is staffed by certified communications personnel and provides twenty-four (24) hour, toll-free telephone access for emergency or non-emergency citizen request for service.

The City of Fredericksburg is part of the National Capital Region. The National Capital Region was created pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952 (Title 40, U.S.C., Sec. 71). The Act defined the NCR as the District of Columbia; Montgomery and Prince George's Counties of Maryland; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William Counties of Virginia. Today, the NCR includes the District of Columbia and eleven local jurisdictions in the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia.

### 7.4.3 County EMA Response Teams

The Fredericksburg Fire Department under the direction of the Virginia Department of Emergency Management currently operates a Regional Hazardous Materials Response Team. It is one of thirteen Level III teams throughout the State and provide service to all or part of eleven counties & cities. The team consists of (21) contract members; fourteen are certified at the Technician level and seven are certified at the Specialist level. The team responds to a variety of chemical related incidents including those occurring at water / wastewater treatment facilities, incidents involving the transportation industry and incidents at industrial and fixed-facility locations. In addition, the team also maintains the capability to respond to and mitigate incidents involving terrorism and chemical, biological & radiological threats.





### 7.6 City of Manassas Park, VA

### 7.6.1 Area of Responsibility

The City of Manassas Park is located in the northeastern part of the state. It is bordered by Prince William County to the southwest, south, east and north, and by the City of Manassas Park to the northwest, west and southwest. The City of Manassas Park has a population of about 16,495. The address of the Office of Emergency Management is: 9080 Manassas Dr., Manassas Park, VA 20111 (Telephone 703-335-8813).

### 7.6.2 Response Systems and Policies

The City of Manassas Park has an Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) for the management of major emergencies and disasters within the city. It identifies how the City will respond to and recover from a major incident and is triggered when it becomes necessary to mobilize resources to save lives and protect property and infrastructure. The Plan is in compliance with National Incident Management System (NIMS) and Emergency Management Accreditation System standards.

Successful implementation of the Plan is contingent upon a collaborative approach with a wide range of partner agencies and organizations, at the local, state and federal levels, that provide crucial support during emergency operations.

The City of Manassas Park is part of the National Capital Region. The National Capital Region was created pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952 (Title 40, U.S.C., Sec. 71). The Act defined the NCR as the District of Columbia; Montgomery and Prince George's Counties of Maryland; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William Counties of Virginia. Today, the NCR includes the District of Columbia and eleven local jurisdictions in the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia.





### 7.8.2 Response Systems and Policies

The Director of Emergency Services is the Chairman of the County Board of Supervisors. The day-to-day activities of the emergency preparedness program have been delegated to the Emergency Services Coordinator. The Emergency Services Director, in conjunction with the Emergency Services Coordinator, will direct and control emergency operations in time of emergency and issue directives to other services and organizations concerning disaster preparedness.

The day-to-day activities of the emergency management program, for which the Coordinator of Emergency Management is responsible, include developing and maintaining an Emergency Operations Plan, maintaining the County EOC in a constant state of readiness, and other responsibilities as outlined in local and state regulation. The Emergency Services Coordinator will assure compatibility between the County's Emergency Operations Plan and the plans and procedures of key facilities and organizations within the county. The Culpeper County Public Safety Communications Center operates the County 9-1-1 system.



### 7.9.2 Response Systems and Policies

The McConnell Public Safety and Transportation Operations Center (MPSTOC) is a multi-agency coordination and cooperation center. The 9-1-1 center is a partnership between Fairfax County and the commonwealth of Virginia that brings multiple agencies and functions together under one roof to enhance the effectiveness of public safety response, improve traffic congestion management, and better manage the response to and recovery from major emergencies.

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) provides emergency mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery services to the residents of Fairfax County. OEM manages the EOC and duty officer program and Maintains the Emergency Operations Plan, which covers all natural disasters and man-made disasters excluding nuclear war and provides a basis for the development of programs and procedures to save lives and minimize disaster damage, and to expedite recovery operations after such a disaster. The development and maintenance of this plan and supporting plans is the basis of the local emergency management program.



### 7.11.2 Response Systems and Policies

The Coordinator of Emergency Management, assisted by the Deputy Coordinator and department heads, developed and maintains a primary Emergency Operations Center (EOC) from which to direct operations in time of emergency. The primary EOC is currently located in the Sheriff's Office. The alternate location is the Greene County Rescue Squad Building. The Sheriff's Office and the Greene County Rescue Squad are located on route 33 business south of the Standardsville By-pass.

The day-to-day activities of the emergency management program, for which the Coordinator of Emergency Management is responsible, include developing and maintaining an Emergency Operations Plan, training and exercise coordination, and other responsibilities as outlined in local and state regulations. The Greene County Sheriff is responsible for maintaining the County EOC in a constant state of readiness. The Greene County Sheriff's Office manages the County 9-1-1 center.



The EOC is equipped with a state-of-the-art CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) system, a Computer Automated Mapping system, and Enhanced 911, which allows Communications Officers to immediately find the address from which a 911 call is made, in the event the caller is unable to provide that information.

The mission of the King George County Department of Emergency Services is to reduce death, injuries and property loss from fire, hazardous situations, medical emergencies and other disasters, by providing continuous improvement of emergency services, unhampered by tradition.



#### 7.13.2 Response Systems and Policies

The mission of the Office of Emergency Management is to reduce the loss of life and property from all types of hazards through a comprehensive program of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery. The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) provides a central location to determine situational status, coordinate actions, and make critical decisions during emergency and disaster situations. Emergency Management staff members maintain the EOC during routine operations. Personnel from various departments and agencies in the county along with key organizations outside the county comprise the EOC staff during activation. The Fire, Rescue and Emergency management department also provides administration of the E-911 Emergency Communications Center.

The EOC facility includes the Operations Room, the Communications Center, functional area workspace, break room, and restroom / shower facilities. A digital phone system provides the primary voice and fax communications link. The EOC has radio communications capabilities on an assortment of frequencies to include UHF, VHF, Low Band, and Amateur Radio. A video network provides commercial broadcast, local cable and video tape playback in the operations room and break area. The operations room LAN (local area network) provides for data collection and dissemination along with incident tracking. The facility has emergency power and is intended to provide independent operation capabilities throughout major emergencies and disasters

Loudoun County is part of the National Capital Region. The National Capital Region was created pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952 (Title 40, U.S.C., Sec. 71). The Act defined the NCR as the District of Columbia; Montgomery and Prince George's Counties of Maryland; Arlington, Fairfax, Loudon, and Prince William Counties of Virginia. Today, the NCR includes the District of Columbia and eleven local jurisdictions in the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia.



#### 7.14 Madison County, VA

#### 7.14.1 Area of Responsibility

Madison County is located in the North central part of the state. It is bordered to the northwest by Page County, to the southwest by Greene County, to the southeast by Orange County, to the north by Rappahannock County and to the east by Culpeper County. #### 7.14.2 Response Systems and Policies

The County 911 center has the most current technology for receiving 911, radio communications, mapping and CAD and is considered an "enhanced 9-1-1" center.

State law requires each County to provide an agency of emergency management, which has jurisdiction over and provides services to the entire County. In Madison County the Department of Emergency Management is staffed by a part-time employee who serves as the Coordinator of emergency management services. The Emergency Services Coordinator is responsible for compliance with the planning and reporting requirements associated with the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and for directing and coordinating County agencies' responses during emergency and disaster situations. The Emergency Services Coordinator maintains liaisons with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); the Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM); and the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). The Director of Emergency Management reports to the County Administrator.

The Emergency Services Coordinator prepares a variety of emergency plans that would be followed in the event of an emergency or disaster, and conducts exercises to prepare local emergency responders for any man-made or natural disaster.

The Emergency Services Coordinator also chairs the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC).

The Emergency Services Coordinator also serves as the County's Hazardous Materials Officer. By state law, each County must designate a Hazardous Materials Officer, who is responsible for responding to potential HAZMAT incidents; ensuring that Material Safety Data Sheets required of individuals or entities within the County are up-to-date; and reporting to the Department of Environmental Quality (VDEQ).





### 7.17 Prince William County, VA

#### 7.17.1 Area of Responsibility

Prince William County is located in the North central Piedmont region of the state. It is bordered to the north by Loudoun County, to the northeast by Fairfax County, to the southeast by Charles County, to the south by Stafford County, and to the west by Fauquier County. The County also surrounds the Independent Cities of Manassas and Manassas Park. Prince William County contains 4 incorporated towns and 2 Independent Cities. #### 7.17.2 Response Systems and Policies

The County's Office of Emergency Management (EM) coordinates efforts to ensure that the County is able to mitigate, prepare for, respond to and recover from any type of natural or human-caused disaster. The County uses an all-hazards approach to emergency preparedness which means that planning efforts consider all types of disasters that could occur in the County.

Emergency Management falls within the Department of Fire and Rescue. However, emergency management encompasses the entire County. The County works in collaboration with other community groups including the American Red Cross, Volunteer Prince William and other emergency partners.

In addition to emergency preparedness planning, the OEM also manages the PWC Emergency Operations Center (EOC), oversees the Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), conducts and facilitates training and exercise programs on intra-agency, inter-agency and multi-jurisdictional levels, and manages Homeland Security grants from the federal government


The Office of Public Safety Communications (OPSC) is the cornerstone of the County's comprehensive public safety response system (9-1-1). The main objective of the OPSC is to facilitate the flow of information in a seamless and rapid manner, and to provide aid, comfort and instructions to the public prior to the arrival of police and fire and rescue field resources.

The OPSC provides command, control and information support services to the police department and fire and rescue services. OPSC personnel are often the first representatives of County government to assist citizens in need. Without leaving the communications center, they are usually the first public safety persons to 'arrive' at the scene of a crime, fire or medical emergency.

### 7.17.3 County EMA Response Teams

Prince William County Department of Fire and Rescue maintains their own Hazardous Materials Response Team; however they also participate as members of the North Virginia (North of Routes 234 & 215) and Fredericksburg (South of Route 234) Hazardous Materials Response Teams.

#### 7.18 Rappahannock County, VA

#### 7.18.1 Area of Responsibility

#### 7.18.2 Response Systems and Policies

On October 30, 2000, the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, DMA2K, was signed into law. Thus was established the requirement that local and state governments develop and adopt Hazard Mitigation Plans (HMPs) to be eligible for Federal assistance through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) and the Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) Program. Both programs are administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) under the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

The first Rappahannock-Rapidan Region Multi-Jurisdictional All Hazard Mitigation Plan was approved by FEMA in 2005 and subsequently adopted by the five member counties – Culpeper, Fauquier, Madison, Orange and Rappahannock – and the towns of Culpeper, Madison, Orange, Remington and Warrenton. In accordance with DMA2K, the plan has been updated and prepared in coordination with FEMA Region III and the Virginia Department of Emergency Management. A Local Mitigation Plan Crosswalk, found in Appendix B, provides a summary of federal and state minimum standards and notes where each requirement is met within the Plan.



#### 7.19 Spotsylvania County, VA

#### 7.19.1 Area of Responsibility

Spotsylvania County is located in the North central region of the state. It is bounded on the north by the Rappahannock and Rapidan Rivers, the independent city of Fredericksburg, and the counties of Stafford and Culpeper; on the south by the North Anna River, Lake Anna, and by the counties of Hanover and Louisa; on the west by Orange County and Culpeper County; and on the east by Caroline County. #### 7.19.2 Response Systems and Policies

The Emergency Communications Center (ECC) is staffed twenty-four hours a day, every day of the year. The ECC is responsible to answer all 9-1-1 calls for the County, as well as some administrative numbers for the Sheriff's Office. The ECC provides dispatch services for the Sheriff's Office, the Department of Fire, Rescue, and Emergency Services, as well as the Chancellor Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department and the Spotsylvania Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department.

The Department of Fire, Rescue & Emergency Management provides fire, rescue and emergency management to the citizens and businesses of the County; provides public education services on fire safety; responds to hazardous material incidents; and develops, maintains, and carries out an emergency preparedness plan in case of a natural or manmade disaster. Spotsylvania County provides the services through a combination system. This means that volunteer and career staff works together to deliver this essential service to the citizens and visitors of our County.

Fire, Rescue, and Emergency Management staff conducts fire inspections and investigates fires of suspicious or unknown origin, has established a Smoke Detector Program, oversees a Child Safety Seat Program, and is a participating partner in the Rappahannock Regional Fire and EMS Training Center. The department also conducts public safety education and fire safety awareness programs in the schools and other public

Administrative staff provides administrative/clerical support to the office/field personnel and the general operations of the department. The Chief sets the policies and procedures for the department and coordinates main fire and rescue issues with the volunteer agencies to provide quality services to the Spotsylvania County citizens.

The Emergency Manager oversees hazmat incidents, search and rescue missions, etc., and is responsible for the Local Emergency Planning Commission (LEPC). Completed Tier II Forms that are submitted. The Coordinator conducts exercises for radiological emergencies and natural disasters and is responsible for preparing, updating, and maintaining a variety of emergency plans that would be followed in case of such events.





#### 8.0 District of Columbia

#### 8.1 Washington, D.C.

#### 8.1.1 Area of Responsibility

Washington, D.C. is located between the State of Maryland and the Commonwealth of Virginia. It is bounded by Montgomery County, MD to the northwest, Prince George's County, MD to the east; and Arlington and Alexandria, VA to the south and west. Washington, D.C. has a population of about 618,000. The address of the Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management is: 2720 Martin Luther King Jr Ave, SE. Washington, D.C. 20032 (Telephone 202-727-6161).

#### 8.1.2 Response Systems and Policies

The mission of the D.C. Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency is to support and coordinate homeland security and emergency management efforts, ensuring that emergency operations in the District of Columbia are prepared to protect against, plan for, respond to, and recover from natural and man-made hazards. This is accomplished by: Provide 24-hour emergency operations center capabilities, serves as the central communications point during regional emergencies; develop plans and procedures to ensure emergency response and recovery capabilities for all emergencies and disasters; conduct an assessment of resources and capabilities for emergencies; coordinate emergency resources for emergencies and disaster incidents; provide training and conduct exercises for all emergency first responders, city employees, and the public; coordinate all major special events and street closings and provide public awareness and outreach programs.

In carrying out its mission the agency works closely with other emergency response agencies, including the Metropolitan Police Department, the District of Columbia Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services, the District of Columbia Department of Health and other District and federal agencies, as well as with the major utility companies and non-profit and volunteer organizations such as the American Red Cross and the Salvation Army.


The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency (HSEMA) provides the leadership in devising an all-hazard based emergency management program that assures that government agencies and private-sector organizations are engaged in a process to address continuity of operation planning. HSEMA provides references and technical assistance with the creation of agency and/or organization specific COOP plans. Also, HSEMA provides technical support in the form of training, exercise development, program implementation and evaluation.

Technical assistance provided by HSEMA is not limited to governmental agencies, but extends to private-sector organizations through Business Continuity Planning. Businesses provide vital services and resources; and they should be prepared for any type of emergency or disaster.

The COOP planning process complements tenets of the District Response Plan by assuring continuous provision of essential functions in the aftermath of any disaster impacting the Nation's Capital. COOP planning components are conducive for addressing any type of small or large scale emergency; and these elements conform to the National Incident Management System (NIMS).



# REGION III REGIONAL RESPONSE TEAM (RRT3) GUIDANCE FOR THE DECANTING OF CONTACT WATER IN INLAND, OCEAN, AND COASTAL WATERS

#### INTRODUCTION

During spill response operations, mechanical recovery of oil or certain hazardous substances is often restricted by a number of factors, including the recovery system's material/water recovery rate, the type of recovery system employed, and the amount of tank space available on the recovery unit to hold recovered pollutant/water mixtures, referred to as contact water. The longer the pollutant remains on or in the water, the greater its ability to mix into the water column, possibly forming an emulsified mousse or other highly mixed pollutant/water material, which may increase the volume of pollutant recovery, thus requiring significantly more storage space.

Considering the use of decanting operations during a spill requires State and incident-specific RRT approval for use in inland, ocean, and coastal waters. This document provides guidance, decision-making tools, and documentation to support and assist the Federal On-Scene Coordinator (FOSC) and Unified Command (UC) decision-making in conjunction with an incident-specific Regional Response Team (RRT) when considering the operational procedures to be used in decanting contact water during oil and certain hazardous substance spills in inland, ocean, and coastal waters. For this document, discussions of contact water include both oil and certain hazardous substances as described in the Definitions portion of this document.

This document was developed to identify issues and provide consistent viewpoints and procedures to assist the FOSC/UC and alleviate potential barriers that may inhibit the decision-making process. This is a planning and preparedness effort and we encourage Area Committees to incorporate concepts and information from this document into their respective Area Contingency Plans (ACP). The document is structured in three sections. **Section I** defines the purpose, authority, and scope of the process. **Section II** contains the general guidance and procedures that may be considered by the FOSC/UC when conducting decanting of contact/decant water on applicable oil or hazardous substance spills throughout federal Region III. **Section III** contains five appendices, including the following:

- **Appendix I** Separate protocols for each State or Commonwealth that establish specific conditions or procedures for contemplating any decanting of contact water inside territorial waters (three [3] miles or less from shore), for special managed areas if applicable and the approval or final decision process for conducting such operations.
- **Appendix II** Decision tree for supporting decanting operations for contact water.
- **Appendix III** Suggested procedures, guidance, and standards for the proper decanting operations.

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- **Appendix IV** Suggested monitoring protocols.
- **Appendix V** Optional Information/Decision checklist for decanting operations for contact water.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

This policy addresses the decanting operations associated with contact water generated from incidental discharges and certain hazardous substance releases associated with spill response activities.

- Contact Water is defined as any water that has come in contact and/or is contaminated with "oil" or a "hazardous substance," as defined in the Clean Water Act (CWA) as amended by the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA90), Title I Oil Pollution Liability and Compensation, Sec. 1001.
- Decanting is defined as the process of draining off recovered water from portable tanks, internal tanks, collection wells or other storage containers to increase the available storage capacity for recovered oil. When decanting is conducted properly, most of the petroleum can be removed from the water. Decanting is most often thought of in the context of large spills to open water; however, it can also be necessary during land-based spill responses where oil is spilled into ponds or streams or when there are large volumes of water from snowmelt during spring thaw. Decanting may be necessary on water or on land if the available temporary storage capacity is insufficient to hold the total volume of recovered oil/water mixtures. Decanting is currently recognized as a normal part of response operations that is appropriately addressed in Area Contingency Plans (see National Contingency Plan Revisions, 59 Federal Register 47401, Sept. 15, 1994).
- A *Discharge* as defined by Section 311(a)(2) of the CWA, includes, but is not limited to, any spilling, leaking, pumping, pouring, emitting, emptying, or dumping of oil, but excludes discharges in compliance with a permit under section 402 of the CWA (National Pollutant Discharge and Elimination System [NPDES]). For purposes of the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan (NCP), discharge also means substantial threat of discharge. Note: Discharge is a term specific to oil spills, whereas "release" connotes a hazardous substance incident.
- A *Hazardous Substance* means any substance designated pursuant to 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 302. In accordance with this guidance, the hazardous substances under consideration for decanting operations are those listed substances that do not dissolve into the water column and remain separate or can be released from the water after settling. The term does not include petroleum, including crude oil or any fraction thereof which is not otherwise specifically listed or designated as a hazardous substance in the first sentence of this paragraph. The term also does not include natural gas, natural gas liquids, liquified natural gas, or synthetic gas usable for fuel (or mixtures of natural gas and such synthetic gas).
- Incidental Discharge means the release of oil and/or oily water or hazardous substance that does not dissolve in water within the response area in or near the area where oil recovery activities are taking place. Incidental discharges include, but are not limited to, the decanting of oily water; oil and oily water returns associated with runoff from vessels and

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equipment operating in an oiled environment; the wash down of vessels, facilities, and equipment used in the response; as well as those hazardous substances that do not dissolve in water. Incidental discharges, as addressed by this policy, do not require additional permits and do not constitute a prohibited discharge. See 33 CFR 153.301, 40 CFR 300 for more detail.

- *Oil* means oil of any kind in any form, including, but not limited to, petroleum, fuel oil, sludge, oil refuse, and oil mixed with wastes other than dredge spoil (Section 311(a)(1) of the CWA). Oil, as defined by Section 1001 of the OPA90 means oil of any kind or in any form, including, but not limited to, petroleum, fuel oil, sludge, oil refuse, and oil mixed with wastes other than dredged spoil, but does not include petroleum, including crude oil or any fraction thereof, which is specifically listed or designated as a hazardous substance under subparagraphs (A) through (F) of Section 101(14) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) (42 United States Code [U.S.C.] 9601) and which is subject to the provisions of that Act. Note: Oil does not include propane, liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) or liquefied natural gas (LNG).
- A *Release*, as defined by Section 101(22) of CERCLA, means any spilling, leaking, pumping, pouring, emitting, emptying, discharging, injecting, escaping, leaching, dumping, or disposing into the environment (including the abandonment or discarding of barrels, containers, and other closed receptacles containing any hazardous substance or pollutant or contaminant). Note: the "environment" for CERCLA releases includes the water, ground, and air, not just water and adjoining shorelines, as is the case for the CWA/OPA90.
- The visual appearance of a surface *Oil Slick* is defined in the Bonn Agreement Oil Appearance Code (2009). The document describes the correlation between the visual appearance of oil spilled on water based on known oil thickness. Slick thickness colors range from silver, rainbow, metallic, and transitional dark, to dark and will change over time as the slick spreads and undergoes weathering. Note: A discharge of 15 parts per million (ppm) cannot be seen on the water.

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#### **SECTION I**

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this guidance is solely to support and enhance the ability of the FOSC/UC to effectively and efficiently determine the best course of action when addressing the decanting of contact water into inland, ocean, and coastal waters. The decanting of contact water is a decision to be made by an incident-specific RRT in conjunction with the FOSC/UC. This guidance outlines the decision-making process, identifies issues, suggests procedures, and provides checklists to help standardize the contact water decanting options. Decanting should only be authorized when it is essential to the continuing recovery of oil or certain hazardous substances after evaluating the environmental tradeoffs and if potential impacts will be minimized through this practice. This guidance is a planning and preparedness tool that can be taken in part or in whole and incorporated into various ACPs.

The RRT recognizes that in some instances, the physical containment and collection of contact water during oil and some hazardous substances spill incidents are not feasible or are inadequate, and the effective decanting of contact water as a spill response technique must be considered. These guidelines were developed to allow the FOSC and their State/Commonwealth On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC) partners within the UC, to employ concepts or tools from this guidance to help or assist in the decanting of contact waters to meet the following objectives:

- Prevent or substantially reduce a hazard to public health and safety.
- Minimize the environmental impact of spilled oil and/or some hazardous substances.
- Take full advantage of available containment/collection resources to enhance the efficiency of the overall removal operation.
- Reduce or eliminate economic or aesthetic losses which would otherwise presumably occur without the use of this technique.

During the Deepwater Horizon spill, the United States (U.S.) Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Comprehensive Liquids Waste and Materials Management Plan stipulated, "During oil skimming operations, the objective is to collect oil with a minimal amount of water." Decanting operations on water are conducted under the approval and permitting of the incident's UC. The mix of oil and water that is collected offshore is stored in an appropriate container and the water that settles out is decanted back to sea while the container is still offshore."

The use of decanting is an effective way to deal with recovered water during oil spill operations and has benefits in terms of efficiency and safety (enabling less handling and

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more time spent recovering oil from the waters' surface rather than transiting to and from the intermediate waste handling facility.<sup>1</sup>

#### **AUTHORITY**

Subpart D of the NCP (40 CFR 300) under the Emergency Phase provides that the FOSC, in consultation with federal trustee representatives, may authorize the decanting of contact waters during oil spills based on storage capacity needs for the response. The EPA and the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) shall predesignate FOSCs for all areas in each region.

The USCG has pre-designated the USCG Captains of the Port as FOSCs for coastal zone oil spills and has delegated to them authority and responsibility for compliance with Section 311 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act or CWA, as amended. The USCG provides FOSCs for oil discharges, including discharges from facilities and vessels under the jurisdiction of another federal agency, within or threatening the coastal zone. The USCG shall also provide FOSCs for the removal of releases of hazardous substances, pollutants, or contaminants into or threatening the coastal zone, except as provided in paragraph (b) of this section.

The EPA has delegated its authority for authorization of decanting of contact water to the EPA co-chair to the RRT in Region III. EPA also provides FOSCs for discharges or releases into or threatening the inland zone and shall provide remedial project managers (RPMs) for federally funded remedial actions. EPA will also assume all remedial actions at National Priorities List (NPL) sites in the coastal zone, even where removals are initiated by the USCG, except as provided in paragraph (b) of 40 CFR 300.120.

The RRT representatives from the Department of Commerce (DOC), the Department of Interior (DOI), and the State/Commonwealth have been delegated authority by their representative agencies or governments to represent natural resource trustee concerns and serve as consultants to the RRT or FOSC on these matters.

For oil, International regulation regarding the discharge of oil from vessels is contained in Annex I of the MARPOL Convention<sup>2</sup>. The Convention prohibits the discharge into the sea of oil or oily mixtures from ships, except where: 'the oil content of the effluent without dilution does not exceed 15 parts per million.'

Any such discharge shall be subject to the approval of the national, regional, and area planning document in whose jurisdiction it is contemplated the discharge will occur. Local

regulation and guidance should always be sought prior to carrying out any decanting operations.

The CWA promulgated the implementation of water quality standards and contamination limits for a wide range of pollutants including oil and grease. Specifically, the EPA, in 40 CFR Ch. 1, prohibits, "the discharges of oil that cause a film or sheen upon or cause discoloration of the surface of the water." The U.S. FOSC is granted an exclusion from the NPDES permit requirement for discharges under 40 CFR 122.3(d) which covers, "Any discharge in compliance with instructions of an On-Scene Coordinator pursuant to 40 CFR 300 – The National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan or 33 CFR 153.10(e) –Pollution by Oil and Hazardous Materials."

#### **SCOPE**

This guidance covers protocols that provide the FOSC/UC with procedures and processes to pursue the conditional decanting of contact water to enhance response/removal operations for oil spills within the boundaries of Region III.

In accordance with response planning regimes required by the CWA as amended by OPA90, the responsible party (RP) will be expected to provide sufficient containment, collection, and storage and decanting resources in accordance with accepted response plans. The process for decanting contact water explained in this document **should be considered one of the response tools** to address a lack of available storage resources and to ensure an efficient response.

#### CONDITIONS FOR DECANTING OF CONTACT WATER

The term "decanting of contact water" applies to operations whereby water containing quantities of oil or other hazardous substances, resembling criteria described in 40 CFR 110 (and hazardous products) and mostly in the form of oil sheens resulting from oil/water separation activities (e.g., skimming, vacuum removal, etc.), is returned to authorized containment in the inland, ocean, or coastal waters after most of the free oil is contained and separated within the collection process. This guidance provides consistent and standard procedures for the decanting of contact water operations conducted within the jurisdiction of the federal Region III. The authority to authorize the decanting of contact water rests with the FOSC and may not be delegated. Decisions made in this regard shall be in accordance with procedures developed by the applicable FOSC/UC, the ACP, and consistent with the specific procedures established within **Appendices I, II, and III** of this document.

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#### SECTION II: SUGGESTED GENERAL PROTOCOL AND GUIDANCE

Specific guidance concerning decanting of contact/decant water operations, monitoring, and decision-making are contained in the Appendices to this document. The following general issues are offered for consideration concerning the decanting of contact water operations falling under the provisions of this guidance:

- Safety and Health Concerns Assuring worker's health and safety is the responsibility of employers and ultimately the FOSC who should comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations. Prior to any decanting of contact water operations, a site safety plan should be submitted and approved by the FOSC and the UC.
- Monitors representing the FOSC, EPA, federal trustee agencies, the affected State/Commonwealth, and the RP should have the opportunity to monitor the contact water operations, when feasible. Further monitoring to establish "Continue/Discontinue" data for input to the FOSC can be conducted in accordance with protocols outlined in the monitoring program contained in Appendix IV.
- Prior to any decanting of contact water operations, the FOSC may review the
  Decision Tree in **Appendix II** and complete the checklist in **Appendix V**.
  These tools are optional and have been provided to assist the FOSC/UC in
  consistently implementing this response technique.
- The checklist found in **Appendix V** can be completed for decanting of contact water and provided to interested parties (e.g., the UC, the RRT, etc.) with approval of the UC. This checklist provides a standard tool to document that all pertinent issues or concerns have been addressed or considered.
- The FOSC should continuously evaluate the decision to decant contact water.
- Decanting of contact water should be conducted by trained response professionals using approved techniques and technologies.
- Decanting of contact water should be conducted in accordance with consultations approved by the DOI and DOC, under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act (ESA)<sup>3</sup> and away from shorelines / historic sites protected under the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). Prior to beginning decanting of contact water, a consultation with natural resource specialists should be initiated to determine if any threatened or endangered

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> The National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) categorical exclusion is to qualify for a categorical exclusion, the requested exclusion (i.e., decanting) must not have the potential for an adverse effect that cannot be mitigated or resolved (extraordinary circumstances). Extraordinary circumstances cause an action, that would otherwise qualify for a categorical exclusion, ineligible because of impacts to sensitive resources. In these instances, further analysis is required to determine the nature and extent of impacts. This analysis may take the form of an EA or initiation of the Section 106 process. Extraordinary circumstances include potential impacts to sensitive resources, such as, but not limited to: Wetlands, Critical habitats, Migratory birds, Threatened or endangered species, Brownfields, Coastal areas, Hazardous waste sites, Protected lands such as parks and lands managed by Federal agencies, Cultural resources, or Historic properties. If the request qualifies for a categorical exclusion and there are no extraordinary circumstances or other environmental requirements identified, no further environmental documentation is required.

species are present in the discharge area or otherwise at risk from any discharge operations. Reasonable measures shall be taken to prevent risk of injury to any wildlife, especially endangered or threatened species. An example of a potential protection measure may include, but is not limited to, adjusting the location of decanting contact water to an area within the impacted body of water where listed species are not present.

- Documentation of contact water decanting operations will be required to address any state codes and regulations as well as federal reporting requirements. If an FOSC Report or any other report medium is not required because of the incident, a special report is not necessary to document the decanting of contact water operation. If RRT action is needed to support an operation, a verbal report should be made at the next RRT3 meeting to review the process.
- Recommendations for changes or modifications to this guidance should be
  presented to the RRT3 at any time and forwarded to the Area Committees in
  Region III to address and incorporate into their planning documents.

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# APPENDIX I – SPECIFIC PROTOCOLS, PROCEDURES, OR GUIDANCE FOR EACH FEDERAL REGION III STATE/ COMMONWEALTH

Separate protocols for each state or commonwealth, which establish specific conditions or procedures for conducting any decanting of contact water inside territorial waters (3 miles or less from shore), and for special managed areas, if applicable, as well as the final decision-making authority and procedure for a given State or Commonwealth.

#### **Delaware**

Case-by-case basis; Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) determination (SOSC).

#### **District of Columbia**

Case-by-case basis; Department of Energy and Environment (DOEE) determination (SOSC).

### Maryland

Case-by-case basis; Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) determination (SOSC).

### Pennsylvania

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Guidance for the Decanting of Contact Water

The commonwealth of Pennsylvania strongly adheres to the caveat that the decanting of contact water as explained in this guidance should be considered a last resort response. If it is possible to hold the water at least briefly, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) State On-Scene Coordinator (SOSC), Emergency Response Coordinator or his delegate for the appropriate DEP regional office must be consulted prior to discharge. The DEP regional office may be able to offer advice on a less sensitive discharge point or even a nearby municipal or industrial facility which could accept the water.

The appropriate DEP Regional Director has the decision-making authority within the DEP region's jurisdiction. The SOSC has the total authority of the Regional Director in responding to the incident in question. In this capacity, he directs response efforts and coordinates all other efforts at the scene of a discharge or release. When the Emergency Response Coordinator (ERC) is on-scene, he/she will normally be the SOSC. In the absence of the ERC, the Assistant ERC will normally serve in this role. Other DEP employees may also be assigned this role to ensure there is always a single person in charge of the Department's operation at any one time.

Where there is no ability to hold the contact water and it must be discharged immediately to allow continued spill cleanup, the "sheen test" should be used. This standard essentially controls the discharge to the point of the definition of a

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"harmful quantity." A harmful quantity of discharged oil is one that violates water quality standards, causes a film or sheen on the surface of the water or adjoining shoreline, or causes a sludge or emulsion to be deposited beneath the surface of the water (40 CFR §110.3).

### Virginia

#### Discharge of Oily Contact Water in Virginia State Waters

The discharge of oil into or upon state waters, lands or storm drain systems within the Commonwealth of Virginia is prohibited. "Oil" means oil of any kind and in any form, including, but not limited to, petroleum and petroleum by-products, fuel oil, lubricating oils, sludge, oil refuse, oil mixed with other wastes, crude oils and all other liquid hydrocarbons regardless of specific gravity. For the statutory definition of oil, see § 62.1-44.34:14 Definitions of the Code of Virginia.

Virginia law allows for an exception to this prohibition if a discharge of oil is authorized by the federal on scene coordinator and the Executive Director of the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality or his designee in connection with activities related to the recovery of spilled oil where such activities are undertaken to minimize overall environmental damage due to an oil spill into or on state waters. However, this exception shall in no way reduce the liability of the person who initially spilled the oil that is being recovered. (see § 62.1-44.34:23. A. (viii) of the Code of Virginia.)

Otherwise, the discharge of any material or pollutant which alters the physical, chemical or biological properties of any state waters or renders such waters harmful, detrimental or injurious to the public health, safety or welfare, or to the health of animals, fish or aquatic life is prohibited except as authorized by a permit or certificate issued by the Virginia State Water Control Board. (See § 62.1-44.3 and § 62.1-44.5. of the Code of Virginia.)

Information as to application for the appropriate permit or certificate, or the availability of permitted facilities which may be able to accept contact water can be obtained from the respective regional office of the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality. The location, jurisdiction, and telephone numbers of VDEQ regional offices can be found at www.deq.state.va.us.

### West Virginia

Case-by-case basis; State input required.<sup>4</sup>




Figure 1. Decision Tree for Decanting Contact Water

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


Figure 2. Continued.

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#### APPENDIX III – DECANTING OF CONTACT WATER OPERATIONAL GUIDANCE

Given the indicators noted above and other indicators identified during the pollution incident, the FOSC/UC must determine a standard for the decanting of contact water into U.S. waters. It may be one or a combination of these standards depending on where this decant operation is taking place (inside containment versus outside containment). Any of the following proposals or combinations thereof may be chosen to support the operation. Although these standards are not all inclusive, they may be used as a starting point from which to develop a standard that would best serve the conditions of the pollution incident under consideration by the FOSC/UC.

Annex I of the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution From Ships, 1973 as modified by the Protocol of 1978 (MARPOL 73/78) limits the discharge of oil into the oceans to 15 ppm when a ship is en route. However, there is provision under the MARPOL Convention for an exemption in the case of oil spill operations, "the discharge into the sea of substances containing oil, approved by the Administration, when being used for the purpose of combating specific pollution incidents in order to minimize the damage from pollution. Any such discharge shall be subject to the approval of any Government in whose jurisdiction it is contemplated the discharge will occur."

In the U.S., the EPA's 2008/2013 Vessel General Permit (VGP) for Discharges Incidental to the Normal Operation of Vessels<sup>5</sup> also addresses discharges of oil, including oily mixtures, from ships subject to MARPOL. Such discharges must have concentrations of oil less than 15 ppm. EPA has utilized the visual sheen test as a reliable indicator as to whether oil, including oily mixtures, is not being discharged in quantities that may be harmful.

• Sheen Test – This standard ensures the decanted contact water does not result in a sheen (defined as a silvery, metallic, colored or iridescent sheen). This standard essentially controls the discharge to the point of the definition of a "harmful quantity" as defined in Section 311 of the CWA [Title 33, Chapter 26, Subchapter III, Section 1321, Oil and Hazardous Substance Liability], and as amended by OPA90. A harmful quantity of discharged oil is one that violates water quality standards, causes a film or sheen on the surface of the water or adjoining shoreline, or causes a sludge or emulsion to be deposited beneath the surface of the water (40 CFR §110.3). Monitoring is conducted by visual observation at the point of discharge. Because of normal decanting procedures into boomed product areas, this test may not provide adequate/accurate identification of sheen test.

Owners/operators of vessels operating under the administratively continued permit are expected to comply with the terms and conditions of that permit.

- Visual Monitoring of Decant Water to determine presence of pollutants This standard maximizes the amount of pollutant remaining in the storage containment resource. Monitoring is conducted by visual observation at the point of discharge. The decanted oil/water mixture is discharged into an area within the containment boom that can be controlled by releasing the substance into an approved area or recovering the discharged substance. Pump rates of the decanted oil/water mixture into the contained area are to be monitored and closely controlled with immediate shutdown criteria and procedures known by personnel conducting the decanting operation.
- <u>Discharge Testing/Analysis</u> This standard is the most conservative approach and controls the discharge to the desired amount of pollutant acceptable by the FOSC/UC being released into U.S. waters. Qualitative and/or quantitative monitoring for oil products or hazardous substances can be conducted by visually observing samples, testing, or field analysis from samples taken at the discharge point. The limiting factor in conducting this type of monitoring is the sample analysis time and the ability to proceed with the operation uninhibited. Where possible, within planning and preparedness efforts, sampling protocols identifying acceptable discharge levels and technical teams to conduct this monitoring procedure should be developed prior to the event.

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#### APPENDIX IV - DECANTING OF CONTACT WATER MONITORING PROTOCOL

The discharge operations must be in accordance with the approved Site Decant Plan.

#### ELEMENTS OF A GOOD MONITORING PROGRAM

Elements of a good monitoring program should include the following:

- <u>Clear Objectives</u> Define the question(s) to be answered from the monitoring program. They must be able to support decisions on further use of the technique.
- Meaningful Discharge Standard Any tests or standards developed to determine the extent of the acceptable decanting of contact water should be operationally feasible to the extent practical. The ability to measure or determine whether the standard has been met should not be so laborious a protocol as to prohibit the possibility of conducting the operation. The discharge standard should be viewed as a "trade-off" where our goal is to do no further harm by weighing the amount of product "decanted" or returned to the environment versus the ability to remove, store, and contain greater amounts of spilled product on scene more efficiently.
- <u>Monitor Protocol Design</u> The development of a monitoring protocol for the specific incident conditions.
- Trained Personnel for Decanting and Observation Proper monitoring during the decanting of contact water relies heavily on visual observations by Oil Spill Response Organization (OSRO) operations personnel onboard the skimming/decanting vessel with an understanding of the decanting operation's mechanism of action, environmental concerns, and expected or desired results. Ultimately, the UC-approved incident Decant Plan will provide direction on the requirements for decanting and monitoring. Thus, it is critical that the monitoring/operation personnel be both skilled in the design and implementation of the decanting operation and trained in how to observe and monitor; in most cases, the trained OSRO personnel will monitor the decant operations while state/federal regulatory personnel will monitor downstream. FOSCs are strongly encouraged to use personnel who are pre-identified through their respective planning doctrine. OSRO responders are also trained and have practiced effective decanting during responses.

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#### TESTING AND MONITORING PROCEDURE

It is suggested that the testing and monitoring protocol follow the five (5) levels outlined below. The questions and concerns that need to be answered during the operation will dictate which discharge measure will be used during Level 1 (**This procedure is also addressed in the checklist provided in Appendix V and should already be complete and known before addressing the desired monitoring standards**). The decision on which protocol will be used may involve the following indicators:

- General environment where the operation is being conducted (e.g., inland, near shore, offshore, etc.).
- The location or proximity of the operation to environmental or economically sensitive resources.
- The availability of appropriate containment and storage for recovered oil/hazardous substances.
- The efficiency of offloading full storage receptacles (e.g., tank barge, Dracone, inflatable barge, temporary shore-side tanks, etc.).

It's a good best practice for the response operations to conduct field monitoring of these operations. The response organization has the right to monitor and change the process as necessary.

#### Level 1: Choosing a Discharge Standard

Given the indicators noted above and other indicators identified during the pollution incident, the FOSC/UC must determine a standard for the decanting of contact water into waters of the U.S. Any of the following proposals or combinations thereof may be chosen to support the operation. Although these standards are not all inclusive, they may be used as a starting point from which to develop a standard that would best serve the conditions of the pollution incident under consideration by the FOSC/UC.

Refer to discussion in Annex III of the MARPOL Convention for detailed information on discharge standards.

#### Level 2: Effectiveness of Protocol Standard

The objective is to determine whether the protocol standard is working under the existing field conditions. The protocol standard should be reviewed and approved by agency representatives and operations staff. The response operations should suggest changes to the protocol to make them feasible in the field while meeting the stated goals and objectives. They will also identify the equipment and resources necessary to support the protocol.

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Measures of effectiveness can be visual, as long as they are objective and well defined (e.g., sea state, sheen test, level of oil/hazardous substance decanted and discharge, etc.) or based on sampling and chemical analysis. Be sure to evaluate the following:

- The equipment used to support the operation (e.g., pumps, shutdowns, containment boom effectiveness, etc.).
- The logistics required and potential problems for full-scale operations.
- Physical impacts during the operation (e.g., sea state, allowing oil and hazardous substances/water separation, ability to safely pump oil from receptacle and control the rate of discharge, etc.).

#### **Level 3: Effects of the Operation**

The objective is to determine whether the operational use of decanting is likely to cause more harm than the tradeoff of having to provide more contact water storage operations. This monitoring scheme in most cases can be conducted by observing the area of the discharge/containment portion of the operation. The end results of the decanted and discharged pollutant need to be within the standard identified in the developed protocol. The main question to be answered is as follows: "Is the tradeoff of efficiency versus potential impact acceptable, given the noticeable increase in the ability to collect and store recovered oil on-scene?" Points to consider include the following:

- Whether the efficiency of the recovery and collection process meets stated goals.
- Whether the containment site for the decanted/discharged oil or hazardous substance is in the best feasible area to do the least harm to natural resources.
- Whether descriptive near-shore surveys at the decanting site have been conducted to allow a comparison of the operation before and after the initiation of the protocol. If the decanting site is within the area of containment, it may not be readily determined whether the efficiency is appropriate.
- If natural separation (settling) time is being allowed prior to decanting and what the discharge volumes will be.

#### **Level 4: Operational First-Use Monitoring**

The objective is to determine whether full-scale operational use of the selected decanting of contact water protocol is effective and does not have unacceptable impacts. Again, it is necessary to have a detailed monitoring plan for approval by involved agencies.

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#### **Level 5: Continued Monitoring**

The objective is to routinely monitor the progress of the contact water decanting operation to continually assess the need for modifying the protocol used. Field monitors should ensure that the approved methods are being properly implemented. Weather, sea-state, or other physical processes may render approved methods ineffective, requiring either termination of the operation or adjustment to other methods.

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#### APPENDIX V – DECANTING OF CONTACT WATER OPERATIONAL CHECKLIST

The RRT3 has developed this "Decanting of Contact Water Operational Checklist" to support and assist the FOSC and UC member agencies in their respective decision-making for various contact water decanting operations. **The Operations Section completes this form.** This checklist could be used as a guide to ensure all issues and operational standards are addressed. This document will provide justification to the FOSC/UC for recommendations from the Operations Section with input from the OSROs.

The checklist separates the operational information into the following "Steps." The completion or the need to address these "Steps" will result in a methodical protocol for decision-making or operational implementation of decanting of contact water procedures. This checklist can also be used as an operational plan for the event. The "Steps" are as follows:

- Step 1: Spill, Pollutant, and Environment Background Information
- Step 2: Evaluating the Need to Dispose of Contact Water
- **Step 3**: Operational Feasibility Checklist Weather and Oil Conditions
- Step 4: Operational Acceptability
- Step 5: Controls, Conditions, and Monitoring

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) BETWEEN
U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY - REGION III AND
U.S. COAST GUARD - FIFTH DISTRICT

#### **Purpose**

The intent of this Memorandum between the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region III and the United States Coast Guard (USCG), Fifth District is to delineate the Region III Inland and Coastal Zone geographical boundaries establishing responsibility for the On-Scene Coordinator (OSC) for pollution response, pursuant to the Clean Water Act, as amended, (CWA), 33 U.S.C. §§ 1251 - 1387; and the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Contingency Plan (NCP), 40 C.F.R. §§ 300.5 and 300.120.

#### **Definitions**

The following definitions will apply to this Memorandum of Agreement (MOA):

Vessel - Every description of watercraft or other artificial contrivance used, or capable of being used, as a means of transportation on water. This definition excludes permanently moored structures, which, while they may appear to be vessels are not inspected by the Coast Guard, i.e., barges moored at facilities effectively used as part of a non-transportation-related facility complex.

Commercial Vessel - As defined in this MOA, commercial vessel means tank vessels (ships and barges); freight ships and barges; commercial fishing vessels; inspected passenger vessels; and uninspected towing vessels. This definition excludes recreational vessels and uninspected passenger vessels carrying six or fewer persons for hire.

Marine Transportation-Related Facility (MTR Facility) - Any onshore facility or segment of a complex regulated under section 311 (j) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act by two or more Federal agencies, including piping and any structure used or intended to be used to transfer oil to or from a commercial vessel. The marine transportation-related portion of the complex extends from the facility oil transfer system's connection with the commercial vessel to the first valve inside the secondary containment surrounding tanks in the non-transportation-related portion of the facility or, in the absence of secondary containment, to the valve or manifold adjacent to the tanks comprising the non-transportation-related portion of the facility, unless another location has been agreed to by the USCG Captain of the Port (COTP) and the appropriate Federal official.

Facility – means (1) a Facility, as defined by Section 101(9) of Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, as amended (CERCLA), 42 U.S.C. § 9601(9), to mean any building, structure, installation, equipment, pipe or pipeline (including any pipe into a sewer or publicly owned treatment works), well, pit, pond, lagoon, impoundment, ditch, landfill, storage container, motor vehicle, rolling stock, or aircraft, or any site or area, where a hazardous substance has been deposited, stored, disposed of, or placed, or otherwise come to be located; but does not include any consumer product in consumer use or any vessel (CERCLA Facility), as well as (2) a Facility, as defined by Section 1001(9) of the Oil Pollution Act (OPA), and Section 311(a)(10) and (11) of the Clean Water Act, as amended (CWA), 33 U.S.C. §§ 2710(9) and 1321(a)(10) and (11), to mean any structure, group of structures, equipment, or device (other than a vessel) which is used for one or more of the following purposes: exploring for, drilling for, producing, storing, handling, transferring, processing, or transporting oil, and this term includes any motor vehicle, rolling stock, or pipeline used for one or more of these purposes (OPA Facility).

Pollution Response – means a "removal" of a "discharge" of "oil," as those terms are defined in Section 311(1), (2) and (8) of the CWA and Section 1001(7), (23) and (30) of the OPA, as well as a "response" to a "release" of "hazardous substances," as those terms are defined by Section 101(14), (22) and (25) of CERCLA.

*Road* - For boundary sections that are designated by the use of the median strip as the line on roads, the Inland Zone shall include the median strip.

Riverbank - The land along the edge of a river, which is at the level of the mean high water mark.

*Tide* - The periodic variation in the surface level of the oceans and of bays, inlets, and tidal regions of rivers, which is at the level of the mean high water mark.

#### **Inland/Coastal Zone Boundary Designation**

EPA Region III provides the OSC for pollution response in the Inland Zone. The cognizant USCG COTP is the pre-designated OSC for pollution response in the Coastal Zone, as defined in the NCP, 40 C.F.R. § 300.5.

Precise boundaries are determined by EPA/USCG agreements and identified in federal regional contingency plans. The Inland and Coastal Zone geographical boundaries for Region III can be found in Attachment A (Written Boundaries) and Attachment B (Geographical Boundaries).

#### **General Response Provisions**

These provisions apply to all EPA OSCs and USCG COTP/OSCs serving Federal Region III. In Region III, the EPA and USCG will carry out agency and specific pollution response responsibilities under the NCP, the Regional Contingency Plan (RCP), and the applicable Area Contingency Plan (ACP), and will assist each other to the fullest extent

possible to prevent or minimize the impacts of an actual discharge or release, or a substantial threat of such a discharge or release, of an oil or hazardous substance where each respective agency has jurisdiction.

The designated boundary lines are intended to delineate the area of responsibility for federal response action to a discharge of oil or a release of a hazardous substance within Federal Region III and describe the transition point from the Coastal Zone (USCG jurisdiction) to the Inland Zone (EPA jurisdiction). For ease, boundaries were drawn following roads, state boundaries, and other landmarks and, as a general rule, the location of the source of the discharge in relation to the boundary will be the determining factor of which agency provides the OSC. However, this MOA recognizes the USCG's primary mission and expertise over discharges and releases in or threatening navigable waters subject to the tide, and EPA's primary mission and expertise for discharges and releases that occur on or threaten land and non-tidal, navigable waters. Therefore, the boundaries do not preclude one agency from transferring to the other agency OSC responsibilities for releases and/or discharges which occur within its zone, as set forth below.

The USCG, through the cognizant COTP, will assist the Inland Zone EPA OSC, consistent with applicable agency responsibilities and authorities. The USCG COTP will assume the role of OSC in response to an incident in the Inland Zone when it involves a commercial vessel, a commercial vessel transfer operation, the MTR portion of a facility, and results in an actual discharge or threatened discharge of oil or release of a hazardous substance into or on the navigable waters of the United States, its shoreline or the riverbank.

The EPA, through the EPA OSC, will assist the Coastal Zone USCG OSC, consistent with applicable agency responsibilities and authorities. The EPA will assume the role of OSC in response to an incident in the Coastal Zone when it involves a CERCLA and/or OPA Facility and results in an actual or threatened discharge of oil, or an actual or threatened release of a hazardous substance, that occurs on or threatens land and non-tidal, navigable waters.

The designated boundary lines do not preclude mutual assistance between the two agencies. Either agency can request the other to become the OSC when the requesting (lead) agency believes that the other agency can respond more effectively. The lead agency can request the other agency to determine whether it has the expertise and resources to mount an effective response, and accept or decline the request to serve as the OSC. Transferring Federal OSC authority from one agency to another can be done by verbal agreement between an EPA OSC and the USCG COTP. This verbal agreement shall be documented in a Pollution Report (POLREP) from the agency taking over the Federal OSC authority within 30 days of this verbal agreement.

Regardless of any agreements within this MOA, it is the responsibility of the EPA (for all Inland Zone responses) and the USCG (for all Coastal Zone responses) to ensure that the other agency (EPA or USCG) has properly taken over OSC responsibilities in its zone prior to relieving itself of any OSC responsibility.

#### **Amendments and Effective Date**

This agreement will be subject to review and amendment coincident with each periodic review of the Regional, Area, and other applicable contingency plans and any other time at the request of either of the parties. This document may be cancelled in whole or in part by any party thereto. Any cancellation will take place 30 days following delivery of written notification to EPA or USCG. It will remain in effect until modified or terminated by mutual agreement.

Requests or recommendations for modification to the Inland/Coastal boundary delineations or modifications to this MOA shall be referred to EPA Region III and USCG Fifth District prior to consideration. Those points of contact shall be:

Regional and Area Contingency Plans of the signatory agencies will be amended to reflect the following geographical boundaries and agreements contained herein. This MOA supercedes other MOAs previously in effect concerning the federal OSC boundaries for purposes of pollution response within Federal Region III. This document is effective upon the date that it is fully executed by both parties.

Written Boundary

#### Sector Baltimore

Start at a point latitude 38°27'15" N, longitude 75°30'00" W. on the Delaware-Maryland boundary, proceeding along the Delaware-Maryland boundary west to a point at latitude 38°27'37" N, longitude 75°41'35" W and north to the Pennsylvania boundary at a point latitude 39°43'22" N, longitude 75°47'17" W; thence west along the Pennsylvania-Maryland boundary to the West Virginia boundary at a point latitude 39°43'16" N, longitude 79°28'36" W; thence south and east along the Maryland-West Virginia boundary to the intersection of the Maryland-Virginia-West Virginia boundaries at a point latitude 39°19'17" N, longitude 77°43'08" W; thence southwest along the Loudoun County, VA boundary to the intersection with Fauquier County, VA at a point latitude 39°00'50" N, longitude 77°57'43" W; thence east along the Loudoun County, VA boundary to the intersection with the Prince William County, VA boundary at a point latitude 38°56'34" N, longitude 77°39'18" W; thence south along the Prince William County boundary to the intersection with Stafford County, VA, at a point latitude 38°33'22" N, longitude 77°31'52" W; thence east along the Prince William County, VA boundary to a point near the western bank of the Potomac River at latitude 38°30'11" N, longitude 77°18'01" W; thence south and east along the southern bank of the Potomac River to the Maryland-Virginia boundary at a point latitude 37°53'25" N, longitude 76°14'12" W; thence east along the Maryland-Virginia boundary as it proceeds across the Chesapeake Bay, Tangier and Pocomoke Sounds, Pocomoke River, and Delmarva Peninsula to a point on the Maryland-Virginia boundary near the Atlantic coast at latitude 38°00'18" N, longitude 75°30'00" W; thence north to the Delaware-Maryland boundary at the point of origin.

#### Sector Delaware Bay

North along State Highway 113 from the MD/DE state line to its intersection with US 9 in DE; then northward along US 9 to the southern bank of the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal (C & D Canal); then westward along the southern bank to the DE/MD state line, and then eastward along the northern bank of the C & D Canal to US 9, and then north along US 9 to its intersection with 1-495; then northward along 1-495 to its intersection with 1-95 at the PA/DE border; then northward along 1-95 to the Schuylkill River, and then along the high tide mark of the Schuylkill River to the dam at Fairmont Park, and then northward on I-95 to its intersection with US Highway 1; then northward along US Highway 1 to the US Highway 1 bridge between Morrisville, PA and Trenton, NJ.

#### Sector Hampton Roads

The southern boundary extends from the offshore extent of the Exclusive Economic Zone at 34-59.8N, 071-28.0W shoreward along 34-59.8N to the VA/NC border. Then along the border to the west bank of the Dismal Swamp canal; north along the west bank of the Hwy.13 to State Hwy. 10, along State Hwy. 10 to State Hwy. 156; then north along State Hwy. 156 over the Benjamin Harrison Highway Bridge in Hopewell, VA, to State Hwy.5; then east on Interstate 64; then west on U.S. Interstate 64 to State Hwy 30; north on State Hwy. 30 to State Hwy. 33; east on State Hwy. 33; west on State Hwy. 33 to U.S. Route 17; north on U.S. route 17 to State Hwy. 360; east on State Hwy. 360 across the bridge in Tappahannock, VA. To State Hwy. 3; south on State Hwy. 3 to State Hwy. 202; north on State Hwy. 200 to State Hwy. 360; west on State Hwy. 360 to State Hwy. 202; north on State Hwy. 202 to State Hwy. 3; west on State Hwy 3 to State Hwy. 205; north along State Hwy 205 to State Hwy. 218; north along Hwy. 218 to State Hwy 301; east along State Hwy. 301 to the west bank of the Potomac River; east along the VA-MD border; across the eastern shore then out to sea to the offshore extent of the Exclusive Economic Zone.
