- OR&R's internal website that is used to share information during oil spill or other pollution response operations within NOAA and federal, state and local government stakeholders.
- Automatically creates new incidents in OR&R's ERMA® (Environmental Response Management Application)
- Provides NRT Notifications to account holders
- Provides users access to Incident Hotlines



- Access to ResponseLink
 - account required
 - requester must have a federal, state or local government agency email address
 - no public access
 - Public facing website is: incidentnews.noaa.gov
 - no access for Responsible Parties or their contractors
- Level of Permissions
 - Admin
 - Editor
 - Contributor
 - Responder



- Responder level can:
 - view Incident Hotlines
 - view NRC Notifications by RRT Region
 - search Incident Hotlines and posts

IMPORTANT

- IF you are a Government responder, get a Response Link Acct. Request from Email: orr.incidentnews@noaa.gov. Mention NOAA SSC Brad Benggio as your sponsor.
- If we have an incident, and you do not have an active Response Link account, you cant access NOAA response support information and updates. (trajectories, model outputs, resources at risk, chemistry, situation updates, etc.) Account requests may take several days to take affect.
- You must log in every 6 months or your account goes inactive and you must request re-activation. Again, could result in several days of delay.
- There is a public side to Response link at Incidentnews.noaa.gov Information here is basic and authorized for public dessemination. For the "full monty" you need an official Response Link account. ONLY available for federal and state official responders who have been vetted by a NOAA SSC or qualified sponsor.
