



Regional Response Team III States and Commonwealths

Each state governor is requested to designate one state office / representative to represent the state on the appropriate Regional Response Team (RRT). The state's office or representative may participate fully in all activities of the appropriate RRT. Each state governor is also requested to designate a lead state agency that will direct state-lead response operations. This agency is responsible for designating the lead state response official for federal and/or state-lead response actions, coordinating and communicating with any other state agencies, as appropriate. Local governments are invited to participate in activities on the appropriate RRT as may be provided by state law or arranged by the state's representative. Indian tribes wishing to participate should assign one person or office to represent the tribal government on the appropriate RRT.

Roles/Responsibilities

During a response, under the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan (NCP), under the Stafford Act for presidentially declared disasters or emergency, or under the National Response Framework, states and commonwealths play a significant role in the response.

Appropriate local and state officials (including Indian tribes) will participate as part of the response structure as provided in the Area Contingency Plans (ACPs) and Inland Area Contingency Plan (IACP). In addition to meeting the requirements for local emergency plans under Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) section 303, state and local government agencies are encouraged to include contingency planning for responses, consistent with the NCP, Regional Contingency Plan (RCP), and ACP in all emergency and disaster planning.

For facilities not addressed under Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (CERCLA) or the Clean Water Act (CWA), states are encouraged to undertake response actions themselves or to use their authorities to compel potentially responsible parties to undertake response actions.

Because state and local public safety organizations would normally be the first government representatives at the scene of a discharge or release, they are expected to initiate public safety measures that are necessary to protect public health and welfare and that are consistent with containment and cleanup requirements in the NCP, and are responsible for directing evacuations pursuant to existing state or local procedures.
