- Sector Buffalo Command Center received a report of a major fire at the old Bethlehem Steel Warehouse in Lackawanna, New York.



- USCG's major concern was water runoff from the plant outflow falls that lead into Smoke Creek which is drains into Lake Erie.
- The Warehouse was being used for storing:
 - } Boats
 - } Cars
 - } Campers
 - } Paper
 - Cardboard
 - Recycled Metal



- JUSCG Pollution Responders worked closely with EPA and New York DEC to set up booming strategies to prevent any sheen from reaching Lake Erie.
- 3 7 different fire departments assisted with the response.





Daily boom inspections were conducted until Smoke Creek clean-ups were completed.







2017 CANUSLAK TTX

- In the last few years the number of commercial groundings occurring on the St. Lawrence River has increased.
- In 2017, USCG Sector Buffalo requested assistance from response agencies on both sides of the border to hold a series of exercises to improve the international process.
- January 2017, the first TTX was held to address specific salvage and recovery issues.
- March 2017, the second TTX was held to go over oil being discharged during a grounding scenario.
- May 2017, an Ocean Boom deployment will be conducted in Clayton, NY, designed to train local responders on how this equipment can be used to aid in an oil discharge.
- August 2017, a "Joint CA/US Contingency Plan" exercise using the Canadian and US Lakes annex will take place to end the training series.
